LONG TERM (Years): Potential NORAD redesign, permanent maritime tolls, new carbon baseline.

THE NEW REALITY: The erosion of established norms across defense, health, and trade creates a highly volatile landscape. Collective action is needed to institutionalize security, reject unilateral maritime tolls, and fund biosurveillance to counter asymmetric and biological risks.

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THE CONVERGENCE OF GLOBAL HEALTH EMERGENCIES, THE DISMANTLING OF HISTORIC NORTH AMERICAN DEFENSE ARCHITECTURE, AND A TRANSACTIONAL ESCALATION IN MIDDLE EASTERN DIPLOMACY CREATES A HIGH-VOLATILITY ENVIRONMENT FOR INTERNATIONAL SECURITY AND TRADE.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

May 18, 2026, was defined by a rapid erosion of established diplomatic and security norms. The Trump administration's decision to withdraw from the Permanent Joint Board on Defense (PJBD) marks a significant rupture in the 86-year-old security architecture between the United States and Canada. This move, ostensibly triggered by defense spending grievances, appears increasingly linked to a broader transactional strategy where the administration is leveraging infrastructure projects, such as the Gordie Howe International Bridge, and trade negotiations to extract concessions from Ottawa. The decoupling of security cooperation from

continental stability signals a "rhetoric vs. reality" shift that places long-standing institutions like NORAD under indirect pressure.

Concurrently, the global health landscape has darkened with the World Health Organization (WHO) declaring an Ebola outbreak in Central Africa a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC). The emergence of the rare Bundibuyo strain, for which no current vaccine exists, coincides with the first confirmed Canadian case of the Andes strain of Hantavirus—a pathogen capable of person-to-person transmission. These dual biosurveillance challenges are unfolding as the cruise ship at the center of the Hantavirus outbreak, the MV Handius, docks in Rotterdam for high-level disinfection, highlighting the continued risks of international transit-borne pathogens.

In the Middle East, the ceasefire remains precarious as President Trump issued a stark "clock is ticking" ultimatum to Tehran. This escalation follows a drone strike on a UAE nuclear facility and the official formation of an Iranian "Strait of Hormuz Authority." The Iranian strategy of deploying a "mosquito fleet" of small, high-speed attack boats presents a persistent asymmetric threat to global energy supply chains, further complicating mediated peace efforts led by Pakistan. Domestically, Canada has moved to mitigate Western alienation through a landmark energy and carbon-pricing deal with Alberta, though the agreement's climate modeling remains opaque and its success is contingent on private sector buy-in for a massive new pipeline project.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

The Dismantling of Continental Defense Cooperation

- The U.S. Department of War announced it is [pausing participation](#) in the Permanent Joint Board on Defense (PJBD), a bilateral organization founded in 1940 by Mackenzie King and FDR.
- U.S. Under Secretary of War Elbridge Colby cited Canada's failure to meet [defense spending commitments](#) as the primary driver for the reassessment of the forum.
- The move is viewed by former officials as a "regrettable decision" that undermines the very body where [NORAD was originally conceived](#).

Global Health: Simultaneous High-Consequence Outbreaks

- The WHO declared the Ebola outbreak in Congo and Uganda a [global health emergency](#) following at least 80 deaths and 250 suspected cases.
- The outbreak involves the [Bundibuyo species](#) of Ebola, which has not been seen for over a decade and lacks an effective vaccine or field test.
- Canada confirmed its first case of the [Andes strain](#) of Hantavirus in a Yukon resident who was a passenger on the MV Handius cruise ship.
- The MV Handius arrived in [Rotterdam for disinfection](#), with crew members entering a mandatory six-week quarantine.

Iranian Maritime Escalation and Ultimatums

- President Trump utilized social media to issue a [final warning to Iran](#), suggesting military action if peace talks mediated by Pakistan do not progress immediately.
- Iran announced the formation of a [Strait of Hormuz Authority](#) and proposed a marine transit toll, a move rejected by the United States as a violation of international waterway norms.
- The Iranian "mosquito fleet" of [hundreds of small boats](#) armed with missiles and rockets continues to harass tanker traffic, creating "crippling uncertainty" in global markets.

Alberta-Ottawa Energy Breakthrough

- Ottawa and Alberta signed a deal setting an [industrial carbon price](#) of \$130 per ton by 2040 in exchange for a fast-tracked pipeline to the B.C. coast.
- The agreement aims to see [shovels in the ground](#) by September 2027, although a private sector proponent for the project has yet to be named.
- The deal is contingent on the [Pathways carbon capture](#) and storage project moving forward simultaneously.

Ukraine's Strategic Expansion of Conflict

- Ukraine launched its [largest drone attack](#) on Moscow in over a year, targeting oil installations and weapons facilities.
- President Zelensky confirmed the start of preparations for a [military drone deal](#) with Canada as part of a joint defense production framework.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Biosurveillance / Disease Outbreaks

- Authorities are managing the international risk of the [Andes strain Hantavirus](#), which is unique for its person-to-person transmission potential, unlike other strains spread solely by rodents.
- The WHO signaled that the world is [falling behind](#) on pandemic preparedness, specifically citing failures in international coordination and resource sharing.

International Relations & Foreign Policy

- The Trump administration is reportedly linking the opening of the [Gordie Howe International Bridge](#) to broader trade negotiations and the Section 232 tariffs.
- Pakistan is acting as the [primary mediator](#) between the U.S. and Iran, attempting to negotiate the unfreezing of assets in exchange for enriched uranium concessions.
- Israel intercepted an [international aid flotilla](#) bound for Gaza, detaining approximately 500 activists, including a dozen Canadians.

AI & Technology Policy

- Sophisticated [AI-generated scams](#) using deepfake images of CBC journalists and corporate CEOs have been utilized to promote fraudulent investment schemes.
- The Alberta government expects [AI education kits](#) to be available for school boards by 2028, sparking debate over the anthropomorphic nature of the technology in classrooms.

Trade & Economic Security

- The U.S. Commerce Department imposed new tariffs on [Canadian mushrooms](#), alleging unfair government tax exemptions constitute a subsidy.
- The Calgary City Council is debating [restricting social subsidies](#) (Fair Entry program) to Canadian citizens only, excluding permanent residents and newcomers.

Security Architecture

- The U.S. Senate struck down [federal funding](#) for a billion-dollar ballroom security project at the White House, invoking the "Byrd Rule" to block the expenditure.
- A vehicle attack in [Modena, Italy](#), and a hate-crime shooting at a [San Diego mosque](#) underscore the persistent threat of domestic radicalization and mental health-driven violence.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity this period was dominated by executive-level agreements and social media-driven policy shifts rather than traditional parliamentary debate. In Canada, the focus remains on the legal and regulatory framework for fast-tracking [pipeline approvals](#) and harmonizing provincial carbon prices with federal floors. In the United States, the use of procedural rules like the [Byrd Rule](#) highlighted the ongoing friction between the executive branch's spending goals and legislative oversight.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **The Building Canada Act:** Alberta pipeline could be designated as a project of national interest to bypass regulatory hurdles.
- **\$72 Billion Reconciliation Bill:** billion-dollar security appropriation for the White House ballroom project, which was struck down by the Senate Parliamentarian.
- **CUSMA (NAFTA 2.0) Review:** July 1st review deadline, with Canada's negotiator Kirsten Hillman and Janet Sharette engaged in daily talks.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **WHO Press Briefing:** Ebola PHEIC and warnings about the rare Bundibuyo strain.
- **BC Health Officer Update:** first Hantavirus case and the strict isolation measures for nine high-risk Canadians.
- **Ministerial Interviews (Leblanc/Nixon):** Alberta-Ottawa MOU and the political implications of the carbon price floor.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Transactionalization of Defense

The withdrawal from the PJBD is not merely an isolated dispute over spending but suggests a tectonic shift in U.S. foreign policy where [security alliances](#) are treated as commodities. By linking the [Gordie Howe Bridge](#) opening and historic defense boards to trade grievances, the administration is signaling that "shared values" are secondary to "shared costs." This puts Canada in a defensive posture where its newly achieved [2% GDP spending](#) on defense is already being

dismissed as insufficient by the U.S. Secretary of War.

Pathogen Proliferation in an Era of Fatigue

The simultaneous emergence of [Ebola \(Bundibuyo\)](#) and [Hantavirus \(Andes\)](#) tests a global health infrastructure that the WHO admits is "falling behind." The public reaction remains muted, characterized by pandemic fatigue, yet the biological risks—specifically [person-to-person transmission](#) of the Andes strain—represent a higher lethality risk than previous respiratory outbreaks. The docking of the [MV Handius in Rotterdam](#) serves as a case study for the difficulties in containing pathogens in the maritime sector.

Asymmetric Leverage in Maritime Chokepoints

Iran's "mosquito fleet" strategy is a masterclass in asymmetric warfare. By using [unmanned and small-crew boats](#) to harass tankers, Tehran creates a "crippling uncertainty" that high-tech U.S. naval assets struggle to neutralize without escalating to full-scale war. The move to establish a [Strait of Hormuz Authority](#) suggests Iran is moving toward a legalistic claim over the waterway to complement its physical harassment.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks):

- Expect heightened surveillance and potential new cases of Hantavirus as the [incubation period](#) for MV Handius passengers continues for another two weeks.
- A possible [military response](#) or "Tuesday meeting" on military options regarding Iran could follow President Trump's ultimatum.

- Immediate friction at the Canada-U.S. border over the [mushroom tariffs](#) and the bridge opening rhetoric.

Medium Term (1-6 Months):

- The [July 1st deadline](#) for Alberta's pipeline proposal will be a major test of the provincial government's ability to secure a private sector proponent.
- A potential "runoff" for the [Republican nomination](#) to replace Bill Cassidy will indicate if the "disloyal" branding by Trump remains the definitive factor in GOP politics.
- WHO trials for a [modified Ebola vaccine](#) targeting the Bundibuyo strain will determine the containment success in Central Africa.

Long Term (1-5 Years):

- The disintegration of the PJBD could lead to a [structural redesign](#) of NORAD, shifting it from a binational command to a U.S.-led mandate with Canadian "participation" based on annual spending metrics.
- The Alberta deal's [carbon pricing trajectory](#) (\$130 by 2040) may become the new national baseline, forcing other provinces to renegotiate their own federal agreements.
- Iran's maritime "tolls" could become a [permanent fixture](#) of energy transport costs if the U.S. and allies cannot provide a persistent, low-cost counter to the mosquito fleet.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Security Architecture:** long-term legislation to insulate the relationship from U.S. executive volatility and the "rhetoric vs. reality" gap.
- **Maritime Norms:** Iranian transit tolls in the Strait of Hormuz to prevent a precedent of regional powers taxing global commons.
- **Biosurveillance:** PHEIC for Ebola requires immediate funding for Bundibuyo-specific field tests to prevent undetected regional spread.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Supply Chains:** Strait of Hormuz as Iranian mosquito fleet tactics are likely to persist despite peace proposals.
- **Infrastructure Investment:** Alberta West Coast pipeline offers a significant long-term opportunity, but carries high risk until a primary private sector proponent is identified and indigenous consultations are cleared.
- **Cyber & AI Vigilance:** AI deepfakes, which are now being used in sophisticated scams to manipulate market sentiment and steal personal data.
