This letter is to inform you of the Certification of the petition to call for a special election that would amend the Jamestown Charter to allow for 4-year staggered terms.

Pursuant to North Carolina law, the petition has been checked against the registration records of the Guilford County Board of Elections and that 324 names out of 356 signatures have been determined to be qualified. Our records indicate that 298 signatures were needed for certification.

Dear Candidate:

On the ballot for the November 2019 election, the citizens of Jamestown will be voting on the staggering of terms for Town Council Members. Currently Jamestown Town Council Members are all up for re-election every two years. If approved by citizens, this vote will <u>not</u> extend the terms of office for the current Council Members.

One of the following will apply:

- 1. If the citizens <u>elect to have</u> staggered terms, candidates elected to a Council Seat will be serving a four-year or a two-year term. The two candidates with the most votes will serve a four-year term and the remaining two elected council members will serve a two-year term. The candidate elected as Mayor will serve a four-year term.
- 2. If the citizens <u>elect not to have</u> staggered terms, all candidates filing for Mayor and Council will be running to serve a two-year term.

Our community relies on the dedication of individuals, such as you, who take pride in our community and the initiative to become involved in the local municipal government process. We thank you!
