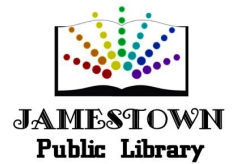

The Town's Director of Planning, Matthew Johnson, was selected to attend the UNC School of Government's Public Executive Leadership Academy (PELA). PELA provides city and county managers, assistants, and key department heads the opportunity to learn about themselves as leaders and to gain skills to lead and manage change within their community. Being selected from the many applicants as one of 25 participants from around the state is an honor. As a condition of their attendance, participants are responsible for selecting a "real world" project for leading change within the community and to develop a plan for implementation.



Matthew has indicated that his project will center on "Citizen Engagement". Often, the process of citizen engagement is prescribed to local governments by state and local laws, which may leave citizens feeling as if their opinions are unheard or underappreciated. Matthew feels that enhancing the methods in which the Town engages with its citizens is important to receiving the information and feedback that is necessary to make informed decisions. He will be presenting his plan to the Town Council at a future date.

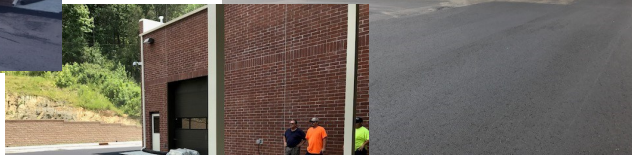
