There will be a primary held on October 5<sup>th</sup> to determine the two final Mayoral candidates. Guilford County Board of Elections has tentatively set the dates for early voting to begin on October 14<sup>th</sup> and end on October 30<sup>th</sup>. The municipal election will be held on Tuesday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>. Citizens are welcome to come and vote in the Ragsdale Civic Center at Town Hall.

It's really important that everyone familiarize themselves with the candidates that are running for Mayor and Council. There always seems to be a lot of focus on federal elections, but the decisions that affect most people's day-to-day lives are made at the local level. The Town Council will help shape the future of Jamestown in many ways. The impact that local governing bodies have is not usually immediate or dramatic. ## PINECROFT SEDGEFIELD

One of the goals of the Pinecroft Sedgefield Fire Department (PSFD) is to make sure that every citizen within our district has a working smoke alarm in their home. The NC Office of the State Fire Marshal documented that there were 119 fire deaths reported in North Carolina in 2020. Of these, only 3 out of every 5 homes had a working smoke alarm. If you have smoke alarms in your home, they should be tested once a month. If you do not have a working smoke alarm, PSFD offers them for FREE to any resident that is in need of one. All you need to do is call our Headquarter Fire Station at (336) 299-4421 and let us know. Our firefighters will come out to your house and install them for you. Smoke alarms save lives! Please help us in making sure that every home in our community has a working smoke alarm.
