- Always clean the grill before and after each use to ensure no flare ups happen.



What is Stormwater?

Storm drains (like those found along curbs) do not go to wastewater treatment plants. Water entering storm drains flows untreated into streams, rivers, lakes and oceans.

Stormwater picks up and carries numerous pollutants into our waterways. Many of these pollutants can cause problems even in very small amounts; therefore we all need to do our part to keep our waters clean.

What is Stormwater Smart?

The Stormwater SMART Program and the Clean Water Education Partnership (CWEO) are cooperative efforts between local governments, state agencies, and nonprofit organizations to protect water quality from the Yadkin-Pee Dee, Roanoke, Cape Fear, Neuse, and Tar-Pamlico River Basins. These programs aim to protect North Carolina's waterways from stormwater pollution through public education and outreach, and helps public entities communicate the important fact the clean water is vital for healthy ecosystems and a high quality of life for area residents.

Teach me One Way to Help

With the Spring weather comes the use of pesticides and fertilizers. These chemicals are transported via storm drains and can cause toxins and algae to build up. Always read and follow the directions carefully, never apply before it rains and never use more than you need.
