# Thinking about a building project?

Call the Town of Jamestown's Planning Department to ask if you'll need a Development Clearance Certificate. Projects like sheds, driveways, building additions, pools, and more require a Development Clearance Certificate before any construction begins. The certificate will ensure that any new structures are built to Town standards. It also protects the property of Jamestown residents as well as Town property. Development Clearance Certificates can cost between \$25 and \$75 depending on the size of the project. # Yard Waste Containers Have Arrived

Jamestown has been notified by the City of High Point that a fine will be incurred if the Town disposes of yard waste in plastic bags at disposal facilities. The Town has been forced to find alternative methods for the collection of yard waste.

Residents now have a choice of purchasing Bio-degradable paper yard waste bags or a toter to wheel to the street.

Interested residents can purchase the toter at Town Hall for a one time fee of \$60.00 and it will be delivered to your residence. The toters will be emptied on Thursday or Friday of each week.
