THE HEATH

Thunder and Lighting. Enter WITCHES

FIRST WITCH When shall we three meet again? In thunder, lightning, or in rain?

SECOND WITCH When the hurly-burly's done, When the battle's lost and won.

THIRD WITCH That will be before the set of sun.

FOURTH WITCH Where is the place?

FIFTH WITCH Upon the heath.

SIXTH WITCH There to meet with MacBeth.

ALL WITCHES: Fair is foul and foul is fair. Hover through the fog and filthy air.

Exit WITCHES

DUNCAN'S CASTLE

Enter DUNCAN, MALCOLM, DONALBAIN, LENNOX, with MENTETH supporting SARGEANT CATHNESS who is bleeding and weak.

DUNCAN What bloody man is that?

MALCOLM This is the sergeant, Who like a good and hardy soldier fought Against my captivity. Hail, brave friend!

MENTETH Say to the king the knowledge of the broil As thou didst leave it.

SARGEANT Hail brave MacBeth - well, he deserves that name. He faced the rebel Tahne of Cawdor Which ne'er shook hands, nor bade farewell to him, Till he unseam'd him from the nave to the chaps, And fix'd his head upon our battlements.

DUNCAN

O valiant cousin, worthy gentlemen! So well thy words become thee as they wounds, They smack of honor both. Go get him surgeons.

Exit MALCOM along with MENTETH supporting CATHNESS. Enter ROSSE and ANGUS

DUNCAN Who comes here?

DONALBAIN The worthy thanes of Ross and Angus.

LENNOX They have a look that seems to speak things strange.

ROSS and ANGUS God save the Queen!

DUNCAN Whence camest thou, worthy thanes?

ROSS From Fife, great king; The victory fell on us.

DUNCAN Great happiness!

ANGUS No more will that villain, the Thane of Cawdor, Deceive the interest if your kingdom.

DUNCAN Go pronounce his present death, And with his former title greet Macbeth.

DONALBAIN I'll see it done.

Exit All

THE HEATH

Thunder. Enter MACBETH and BANQUO

MACBETH So foul and fair a day I have not seen.

Enter WITCHES

BANQUO Fouler still as the day goes on, Macbeth. What are these so withered and so wild in their attire That look not like inhabitants of the earth and yet are on it?

FIRST WITCH and SECOND WITCH All hail Macbeth, Thane of Glamis!

THIRD WITCH and FOURTH WITCH All hail Macbeth, Thane of Cawdor!

FIFTH and SIXTH WITCH All hail Macbeth, who shall one day be king!

BANQUO If you can look into the seeds of time And say which grain will grow and which will not, Then speak to me of what my life shall be!

ALL WITCHES Hail!

FIRST WITCH and SECOND WITCH Lesser than Macbeth, and greater.

THIRD WITCH and FOURTH WITCH Not so happy, yet much happier.

FIFTH and SIXTH WITCH Thou shalt be the father of kings, though thou be none.

ALL WITCHES So hail Macbeth and Banquo!

Exit WITCHES

BANQUO You shall be king! MACBETH And thane of Cawdor too?

Enter DONALBAIN

DONALBAIN Hail, Thane of Cawdor!

MACBETH Thane of Cawdor lives!

DONALBAIN Not for long. He has betrayed the king and is condemned to die. His land and title come from Duncan's hand to thee, In gratitude for your great deeds in battle.

BANQUO Remember, the powers of darkness May use a bit of truth to lure a man to doom.

MACBETH Come what may. Let us toward the king!

Exit All

MACBETH'S CASTLE

Enter LADY MACBETH, reading a letter

LADY MACBETH Yet I do fear your nature, my husband. It is too full of the milk of human kindness. I shall have to urge thee on.

Enter MACBETH

MACBETH My dearest love. Duncan comes here tonight.

LADY MACBETH Tonight! And when does he leave?

MACBETH Tomorrow.

LADY MACBETH Never shall tomorrow come! The Queen shall die. MACBETH Alas!

LADY MACBETH Your face, my thane, is as a book where men May read your thoughts. Look like the innocent flower, But be the serpent under it.

MACBETH We will speak further.

Exit MACBETH

LADY MACBETH Leave all the rest to me.

Enter DUNCAN, MALCOLM, DONALBAIN, BANQUO, LENNOX, MACDUFF, ROSS, ANGUS, and MENTETH

MALCOLM See, see, our honour'd hostess!

DUNCAN Give me your hand; Conduct me to mine host: we love him highly, And shall continue our graces towards him.

Exit All. Enter MACBETH

MACBETH

If it were done, would be well To do it quickly... The king is here in double trust: First, I am his kinsman and his subject, Then, I am his host. I should shut the door against his murderer, Not bear the knife myself-

Enter LADY MACBETH

MACBETH We will proceed no further in this business!

LADY MACBETH: Would you live a coward in your own esteem, Letting "I dare not" wait upon "I would"?

MACBETH And if we should fail? LADY MACBETH Fail? Are you afraid to claim your greatness? Screw your courage to the sticking place!

MACBETH I am settled upon this terrible deed. False face must hide what the false heart doth know.

Exit MACBETH and LADY MACBETH. Enter BANQUO and FLEANCE who is holding a lantern

BANQUO How goes the night, boy?

FLEANCE The moon is down; I have not heard the clock.

BANQUO And she goes down at twelve.

FLEANCE I take it, it's later, sir.

Enter MACBETH and SERVANT, with a lantern

BANQUO Who's there?

SERVANT The Thane of Cawdor.

MACBETH A friend, Banquo

BANQUO What, sir, not yet at rest? The Queen is going to bed. I dreamt last night of the three weird sisters. To you they have shown some truth.

MACBETH I think not of them. Good repose the while!

BANQUO Thanks, sir: the like to you!

Exit BANQUO, FLEANCE, and SERVANT

MACBETH Is this a dagger I see before me, the handle toward my hand? Come, let me clutch thee. I have thee not, and yet I see thee still.

Bell sounds.

MACBETH I go, and it is done; the bell invites me. Hear it not, Duncan; for it rings thy death.

Exit MACBETH

Up stage. A pantomime of the Duncan going to bed guided by SERVANT with a lantern. MACBETH and LADY MACBETH silently enters and each stab DUNCAN killing her. MACBETH and LADY MACBETH drag DUNCAN's body off stage. (Maybe some scary music?)

Enter MACBETH and LADY MACBETH

LADY MACBETH Get some water and wash this filthy witness from your hands.

MACBETH: I am afraid to think what I have done.

LADY MACBETH Infirm of purpose! Give me the daggers!

Knocking

MACBETH Whence is that knocking? How is't with me, when every noise appalls me? Will all great Neptune's ocean wash this blood Clean from my hand?

LADY MACBETH: My hands are of your color; but I shame To wear a heart so white.

Knocking

I hear a knocking At the south entry: retire we to our chamber; A little water clears us of this deed:

Exit LADY MACBETH

MACBETH

To know my deed, it would be best not to know myself.

Knocking

I would we could wake Duncan with thy knocking!

Enter MACDUFF and LENNOX, MACBETH hides his hands

MACDUFF

Good morrow, sir. The king did command me to call timely on him. I have almost slipped the hour.

MACBETH

I will bring you to him. This is the door.

Exit MACDUFF

LENNOX

The night has been unruly. Chimneys were blown down And strange screams of death seemed to fill the air.

MACBETH Twas a rough night.

Enter MACDUFF

MACDUFF Oh horror, horror, horror! Awake! Awake! Confusion now hath made his masterpiece!

Exit LENNOX into the murder chamber.

Ring the alarm bell! Murder and treason!

Enter ENTIRE CAST except for the SERVANT and the WITCHES

DONALBAIN What is amiss?

MACDUFF Your royal father's murdered. MALCOLM By whom?

Enter LENNOX

LENNOX It would seem the very servant who was pledged to guard him.

LADY MACBETH: Oh, help me hence! (She swoons as if to faint.)

MACDUFF: Look to the lady.

Exit ALL except MALCOLM and DONALBAIN

MALCOLM Let's not consort with them. I'll to England.

DONALBAIN To Ireland, I; our separated fortune Shall keep us both the safer: where we are, There's daggers in men's smiles: the near in blood, The nearer bloody.

MALCOLM And let us not be dainty of leave-taking.

Exit MALCOLM and DONALBAIN Enter BANQUO

BANQUO Thou hast it now: king, Cawdor, Glamis, all, As the weird women promised, and, I fear, Thou play'dst most foully for't.

Enter MACBETH

MACBETH Tonight we hold a solemn supper, sir. And I'll request your presence.

BANQUO Let your highness command upon me. MACBETH Fail not our feast.

BANQUO My lord, I will not.

Exit BANQUO

MACBETH Our fears in Banquo stick deep. No son of mine succeeding. If 't be so, For Banquo's issue have I filed my mind; For them the gracious Duncan have I murder'd.

Enter MURDERER

MACBETH You know that Banquo was your enemy.

MURDERER #1 True, my lord.

MACBETH So is he mine.

MURDERER #2 We shall, my lord, perform what you command.

Exit MURDERER #1 and #2

Enter ENITRE CAST except for DUNCAN, MURDERER #1, MURDURER #2, BANQUO, MALCOLM, DONALBAIN, and WITCHES Banquet begins and is pantomimed. Enter BANQUO'S GHOST

MACBETH Which of you has done this?

LENNOX What, my good lord?

MACBETH Thou cannot say I did it. Never shake your gory locks at me!

ROSS Gentlemen, rise. His highness is not well.

Exit BANQUO'S GHOST followed by everyone else

THE HEATH

FIRST WITCH How now, Hecate? You look angerly.

HECATE

Have I not reason, beldams as you are, Saucy and overbold? How did you dare To trade and traffic with Macbeth In riddles and affairs of death; And I, the mistress of your charms, The close contriver of all harms, Was never call'd to bear my part, Or show the glory of our art?

FIRST WITCH and SECOND WITCH Thrice the brinded cat hath mew'd.

THIRD WITCH and FORTH WITCH Thrice, and once the hedgepig whined.

FIFTH WITCH and SIXTH WITCH Harpier cries - 'Tis time, 'tis time!

ALL WITCHES

Double, double toil and trouble; Fire burn and cauldron bubble. Eye of newt and toe of frog, Wool of bat and tongue of dog, Adder's fork and blind-worm's sting, Lizard's leg and owlet's wing, For a charm of powerful trouble, Like a hell-broth boil and bubble.

HECATE:

O well done! I commend your pains; And everyone shall share i' the gains; And now about the cauldron sing, Live elves and fairies in a ring, Enchanting all that you put in.

(They circle the cauldron.)

FIRST WITCH and SECOND WITCH By the pricking of my thumbs, THIRD WITCH and FORTH WITCH Something wicked this way comes.

FIFTH WITCH and SIXTH WITCH Open, locks, Whoever knocks!

Enter MACBETH

MACBETH How now, you secret midnight hags! What is it you do?

ALL WITCHES A deed without a name!

Enter APPARITIONS as they speak. GHOSTS of DUNCAN and BANQUO stand behind the APPARATIONS

HECATE: Macbeth! Macbeth! Macbeth! beware Macduff; Beware the thane of Fife.

BLOODY CHILD: None of woman born Shall harm Macbeth.

CROWNED CHILD: Macbeth shall never vanquish'd be until Great Birnam wood to high Dunsinane hill Shall come against him.

> Exit APPARITIONS, GHOSTS and WITCHES Enter LENNOX

MACBETH: Saw you the weird sisters?

LENNOX: No, my lord! Macduff has fled to England!

MACBETH: To England! The castle of Macduff I will surprise; Seize upon Fife; give to the edge o' the sword His wife, his babes, and all unfortunate souls That trace him in his line.

Exit All

ENGLAND

Enter MACDUFF and MALCOLM followed by ROSS

MACDUFF My children too? My wife kill'd too?

ROSS I have said.

MACDUF: Bleed, bleed, poor country! Great tyranny!

MALCOLM: Be this the whetstone of your sword: let grief Convert to anger; blunt not the heart, enrage it. Come, go we to the king; our power is ready.

MACBETH's CASTLE

ENTER LADY MACBETH sleepwalking followed by SERVANT and DOCTOR. Lady Macbeth mimes washing her hands.

LADY MACBETH Out, damned spot! out, I say! Who would have thought the old man to have had so much blood in him.

SERVANT She has spoke what she should not.

LADY MACBETH To bed, to bed! there's knocking at the gate: come, come, come, come, give me your hand. What's done cannot be undone.--To bed, to bed!

DOCTOR

This disease is beyond my practice More needs she the divine than the physician. God, God forgive us all! Look after her.

Enter MACBETH

MACBETH Bring me no more reports; let them fly all: Till Birnam wood remove to Dunsinane, I cannot taint with fear. What's the boy Malcolm? Was he not born of woman?

Enter MENTETH

MACBETH Where got'st thou that goose look?

MENTETH There is ten thousand...

MACBETH Geese?

MENTETH Soldiers, sir!

MACBETH Go prick thy face, and over-red thy fear, Thou lily-liver'd boy. What soldiers?

MENTETH The English force, so please you.

MACBETH I'll fight till from my bones my flesh be hack'd. Give me my armour.

LADY MACBETH's cry is heard from offstage. Exit MACBETH

Enter MACDUFF, MALCOLM and his SOLDIERS with branches in front of their faces. They march across the stage.

Enter MACBETH

MACBETH The queen is dead. Out, out, brief candle! Life's but a walking shadow, a poor player That struts and frets his hour upon the stage And then is heard no more: it is a tale Told by an idiot, full of sound and fury, Signifying nothing.

Macbeth cries out and runs to the battle. Enter MALCOLM's SOLDIERS and MACBETH's SOLDEIRS from opposite side of the stage Fighting across the stage. Exit All except MACDUFF and MACBETH

MACDUFF Yield thee, coward! MACBETH I will not yield, To kiss the ground before young Malcolm's feet.

Exit MACDUFF and MACBETH, still fighting

ENTER MALCOLM, MACDUFF with MACBETH's crown followed by all of the soldiers

MACDUFF

Hail, king! for so thou art: behold, where stands The usurper's cursed crown

ALL: Hail, King of Scotland!

MALCOLM:

So ends our tale of this dead butcher and his fiend-like queen, Who, as 'tis thought, by self and violent hands Took off her life; this, and what needful else That calls upon us, by the grace of Grace, We will perform in measure, time and place: So, thanks to all at once and to each one, Whom we invite to see us crown'd at Scone.
