

Letter to Donors

Some couples write short (3/4 page) letters, while others write 2 or 3 pages. Some of the topics covered are:

- How long you've been married
- How you met
- Your childhoods
- What you do for a living
- How many children you have (if any)
- If you don't have children, your experience with (and hopefully enjoyment of :) nieces, nephews, children of friends
- What your experience has been with infertility (if that is the case) and how it has affected you
- Why you are interested in embryo adoption
- What type of community you live in (city, suburbs, country)
- A typical day or week in your life
- Any religious beliefs and practices
- Pets
- Hobbies
- Extended family – particularly if they live close by

Obviously, you won't have ALL of these! But they are ideas to jumpstart your letter. We recommend that you take some time with this, but don't stress over it. You can always submit a "better" letter later, if you aren't entirely happy with this one.
