























Digital Painting: Paint a Self-Portrait

National Curriculum Use technology purposefully to create, organise, store, manipulate and retrieve digital content.		Lesson Duration It is estimated that this lesson will take approximately 60 minutes.	
Aim To use painting software to paint a self-portrait.			
Success Criteria I can use different tools to create a digital painting. I can add and format text. I can use the appropriate tool to remove and correct mistakes.		Key Vocabulary Paint, text, font, brush, portrait, self-portrait, colour, shape, fill, format, rubber, eraser, undo, redo.

Mirrors		Preparation Paint a Self-Portrait Lesson Presentation (Google Version) - as required Paint a Self-Portrait Lesson Presentation (Microsoft Version) - as required We advise you choose the presentation that fits with the painting software you are using. - In order to gather valuable data about how effective this unit has been and how much your children have understood the topic, we recommend completing the KWL Grid at the end of this lesson. - one per class Paint a Self-Portrait Checklist - one per child. We advise you choose the activity sheet that fits with the painting software you are using. Microsoft Paint or PaintZ - we recommended using the painting software that is compatible with your chosen device.	

Prior Learning: After completing previous lessons in this unit, children should be very familiar with using painting software. They should be confident in navigating around the painting software and using the tools available.

Learning Sequence

 	Remember It: Using the Lesson Presentation , give children tasks to complete using the skills learnt from previous lessons in the unit. Give children a set amount of time to complete each task. Children will be revisiting the skills of selecting different brushes, changing the size and colour of the brush, drawing shapes, filling areas with colour and adding text. Remind children to use the Rubber/Eraser or Undo tool if they make a mistake. Can children explain the different Brushes they have used and why? Can children explain how they have formatted the text?	
	Knowledge Organiser: Display the Knowledge Organiser to the class. As a class, highlight any words from the key vocabulary section that the children recognise. Can children discuss with their partner what those highlighted words mean?	
	What Is a Self-Portrait? Use the Lesson Presentation to explain the difference between a portrait and self-portrait.	
	Your Self-Portrait: Using the Lesson Presentation , ask children to look in a mirror. Discuss what they see in the mirror and features they would need to paint in a self-portrait.	
	Creating a Self-Portrait: Using the Lesson Presentation , discuss painting the outline of the face. Ask children to discuss with their partners what tools they would use to paint the outline of the face and why.	

	<p>Creating a Self-Portrait: Eyes: Using the Lesson Presentation, ask children to look closely at the shape and colour of their eyes. Discuss what tools could be used to paint their eyes and which colours could be used. With a partner, children should then discuss what tools and colours they would use to paint their eyes and why.</p> <p>Can children name other parts of the eye that they could paint?</p>	
	<p>Creating a Self-Portrait: Hair: Using the Lesson Presentation, ask children to look closely at the style and colour of their hair. Discuss with the children what brush type could be used to paint different hair types and which colours could be used. With a partner, children should then discuss what brush type and colours they would use to paint their hair and why.</p>	
	<p>Creating a Self-Portrait: Other Features: Using the Lesson Presentation, ask children to look closely at other features they have on their face that are unique to them, such as eyelashes, glasses, freckles or moles.</p> <p>Discuss with the children what brush type and size could be used to paint these extra features and to discuss their choices with a partner.</p>	
	<p>Time to Explore: Using the Lesson Presentation, the Paint a Self-Portrait Checklist and the skills explored in the unit, children will paint a self-portrait. Children should use different brushes and shapes, add colour and then use the Text tool to write their names.</p> <p>This activity has not been differentiated. Provide each child with a Paint a Self-Portrait Checklist. Ask children to complete the checklist, deciding which skills they have used in their digital painting. This checklist can be used to assess the children's learning for the unit.</p>	
	<p>Time to Share: Using the Lesson Presentation, explain that the children will need to display their self-portraits on their devices. Children then circulate the classroom identifying where others have used the skills learnt in the unit. Ask the children to choose one self-portrait to discuss with the class.</p>	

Explore it

Create it: Children should use the painting software to design the front of a card. Children could print out their designs and create a card to give to someone of their choice.

Paint it: Using the painting software, ask the children to paint a portrait of a friend. Children should use all of the skills learnt in the unit.

Explain it: Ask the children to design and make a poster explaining all the tools the children have learnt how to use on the painting software.

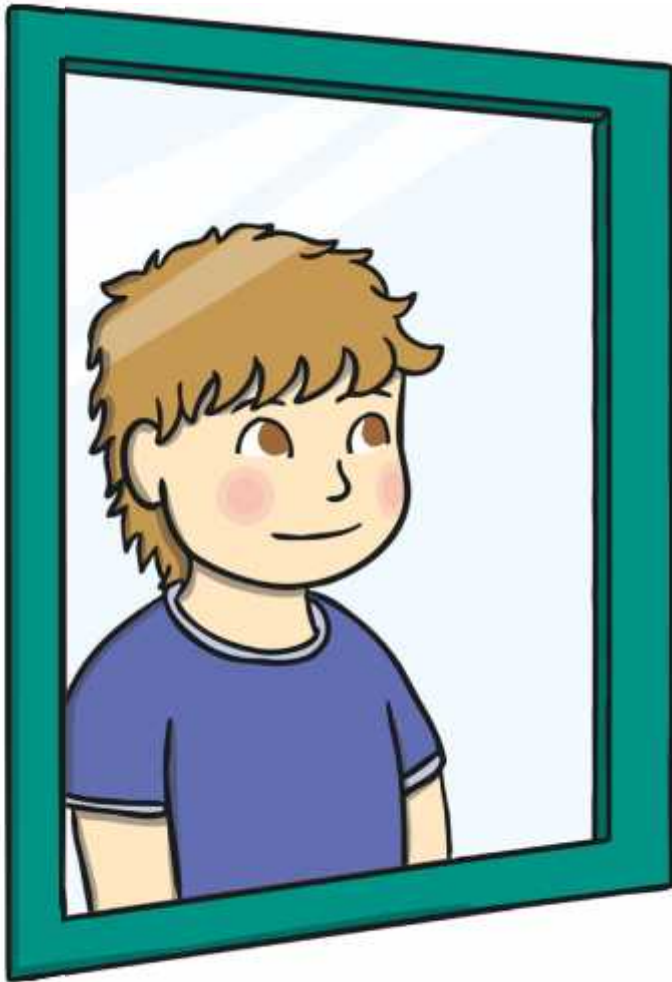
