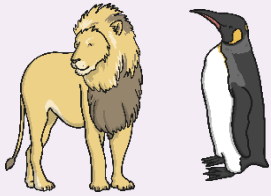

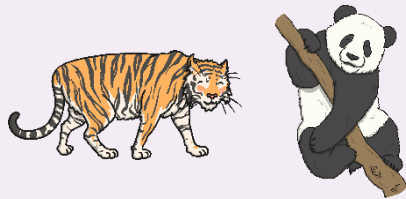
Can you complete the sentences to describe what each child saw at the zoo?
Remember to use the word **and** to join the two animals together.



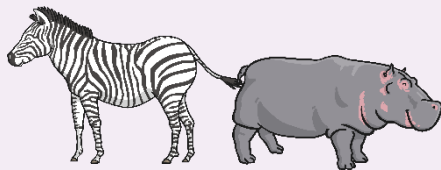
I went to the zoo and I saw **a lion and a penguin.**

I went to the zoo and I saw **a tiger and a panda.**

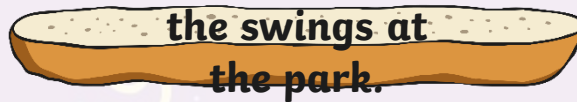


I went to the zoo and I saw **a zebra and a hippo.**

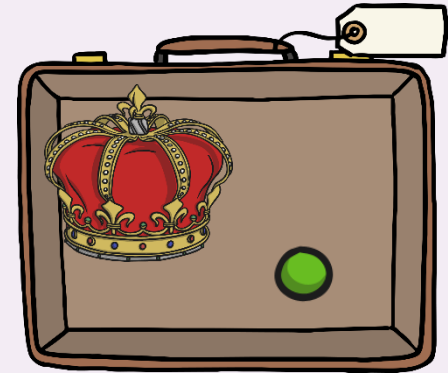

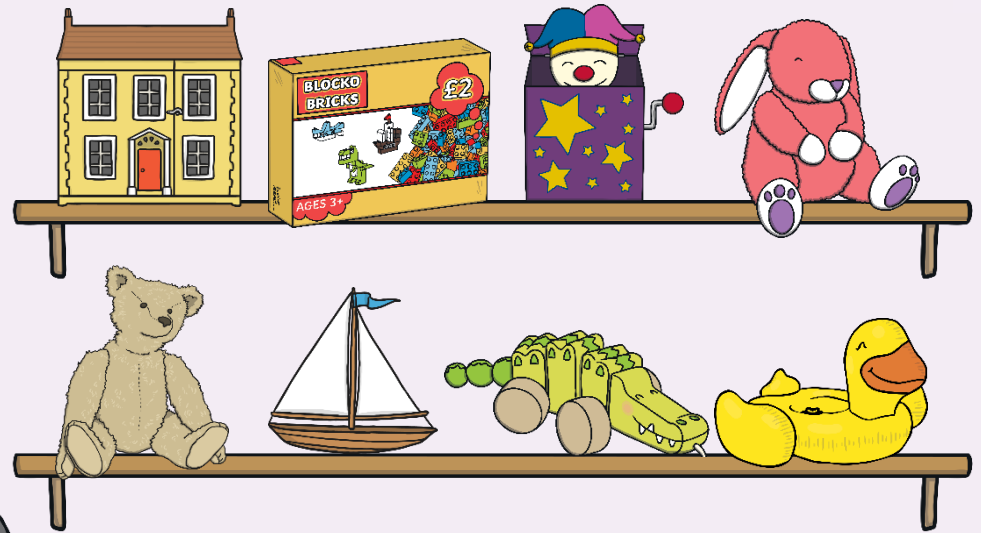

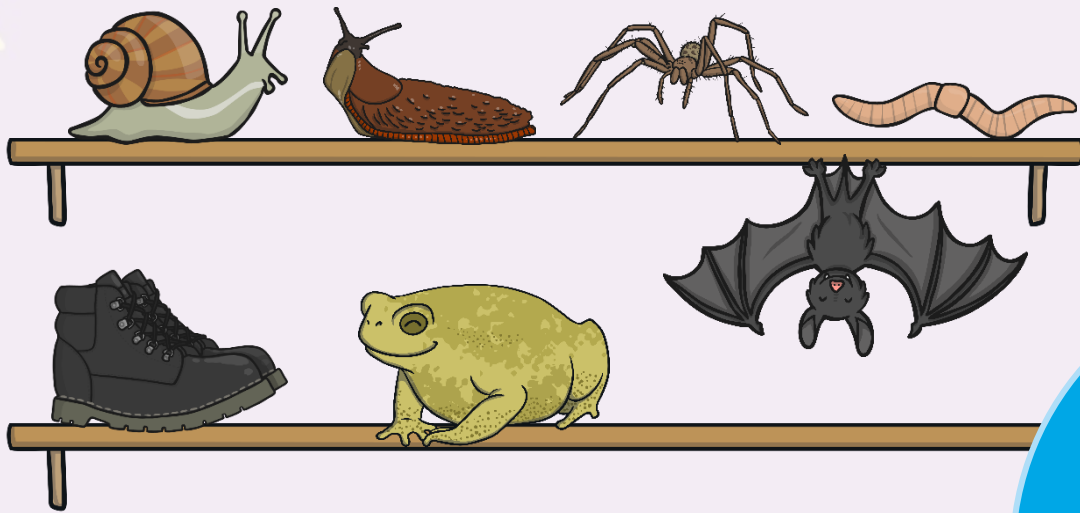
You are allowed to buy two things from the toy shop. Write a sentence to say which two things you want to buy, using the word **and** to join the different parts of your sentence.

I want to buy...

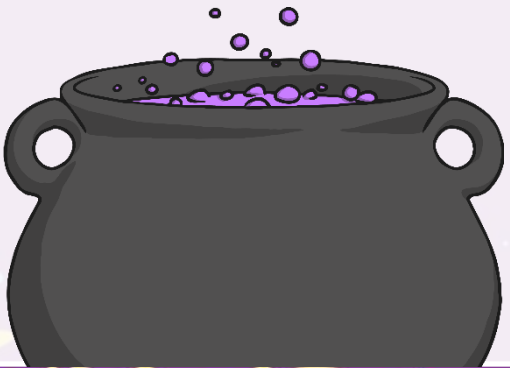


How many **different** sentences can you write, saying **two** toys that you want to buy?

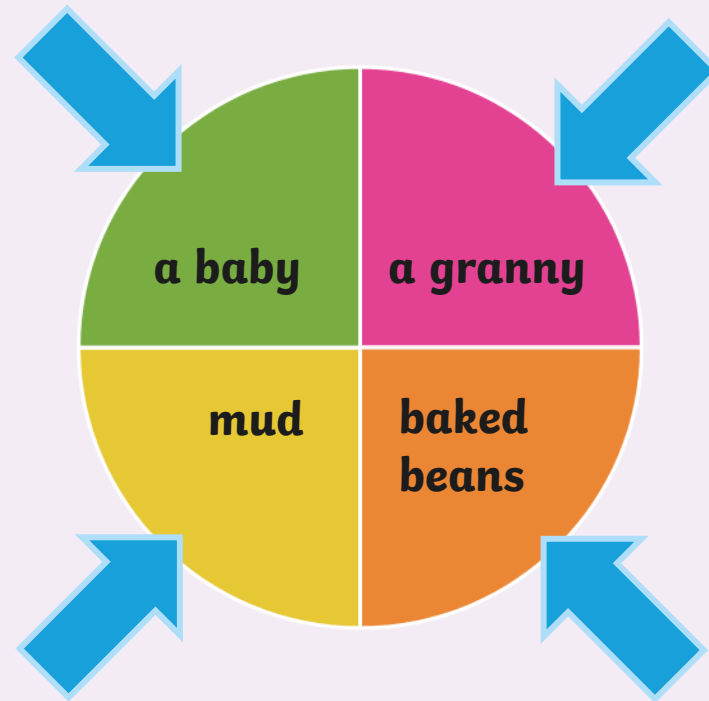
