
This week, we have been learning to read and spell words containing 'ow' and 'oe' saying /oa/.




Top Tip

The graphemes 'ow' and 'oe' can both make the same sound as 'oa'. They are both most commonly used when the /oa/ sound comes at the end (or near the end) of a word, e.g. bow, toe.
