




Can you write the plural of these words? Remember, sometimes you need to add –s and sometimes you need to add –es. Can you put the words into the correct jar for their word ending?

To clean my pet, I use one **brush**  $\rightarrow$  To clean my pet, I use two **brushes**.


The **witch** had one black **cat**. → The <u>witches</u> had three black <u>cats</u>.




Can you sort the words on the coins into plural and singular? Click on each coin to see the answer.

She swallowed the **birds** to catch the **spiders**,


She swallowed the **spiders** to catch the fly,




