


What is a noun?

A noun is a naming word.











What is a plural?

Plural means 'more than one'.







Plural = more than 1 Singular = 1 One dog Lots of dogs One door Lots of doors Lots of pencils One pencil Lots of lamps One lamp




There are lots of rules when changing words from singular to plural.




We are going to look at just two of the rules.



For most words we just add 's' to the end of it to change it into a plural.










If the word ends with one of these sounds...





To change these words in to plurals, add 'es'.
