

Ordering Sentences to Tell a Story

When we write a story, the sentences need to be in the correct **sequence**.

This means they need to be written **in order**, one after the other.

This helps the reader to make sense of the story.

The words at the start of the sentences can also help to keep order in the story and link the parts of the story together.

These words introduce the story. They start the sequence of events.

These words tell us that some time has passed.

Each sentence describes what happens next in the story.

The sentences describe the events in the order in which they happen.

Snow White
