
Guidance for Animations



Every separate 'step' of the Lesson Presentation begins with an animation of the individual number.


While in slide show mode, click anywhere in the square to start (and pause) the animation.


Fine Motor Warm-Up


Finger Presses


Place your hands a few centimetres apart in front of you.

Listen to your teacher. Can you press the fingers together that they say?








Step I – Number Fun







The first player to roll a total of 9 three times is the winner!





