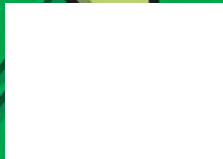


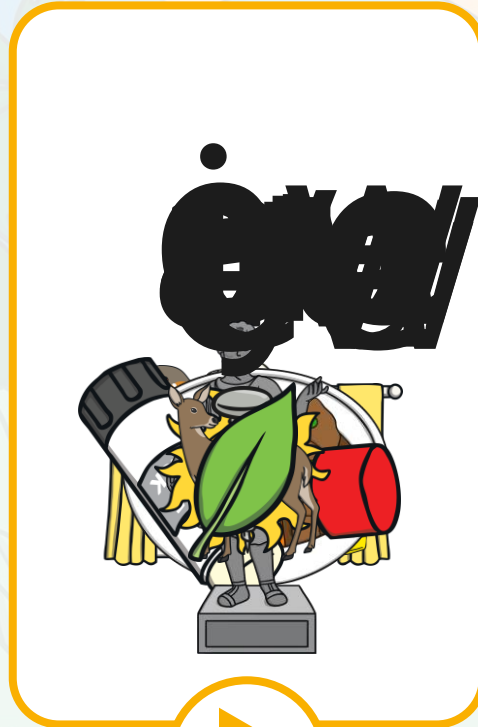

Sometimes, **o** and **e** work as partners to make the /oa/ sound. Let's say these examples:

goes

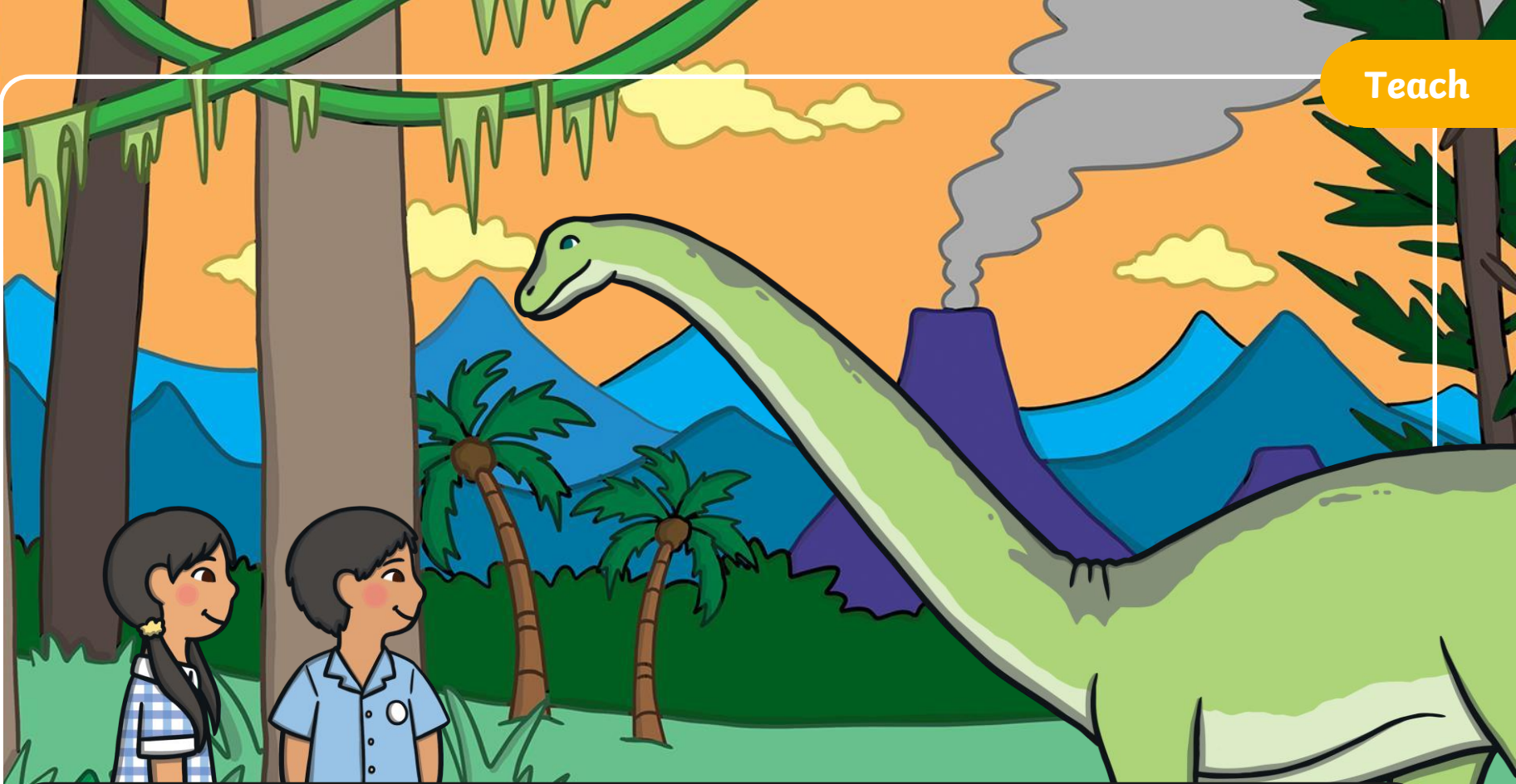
This grapheme 'oe' makes the same sound as 'ow' as in 'low'.

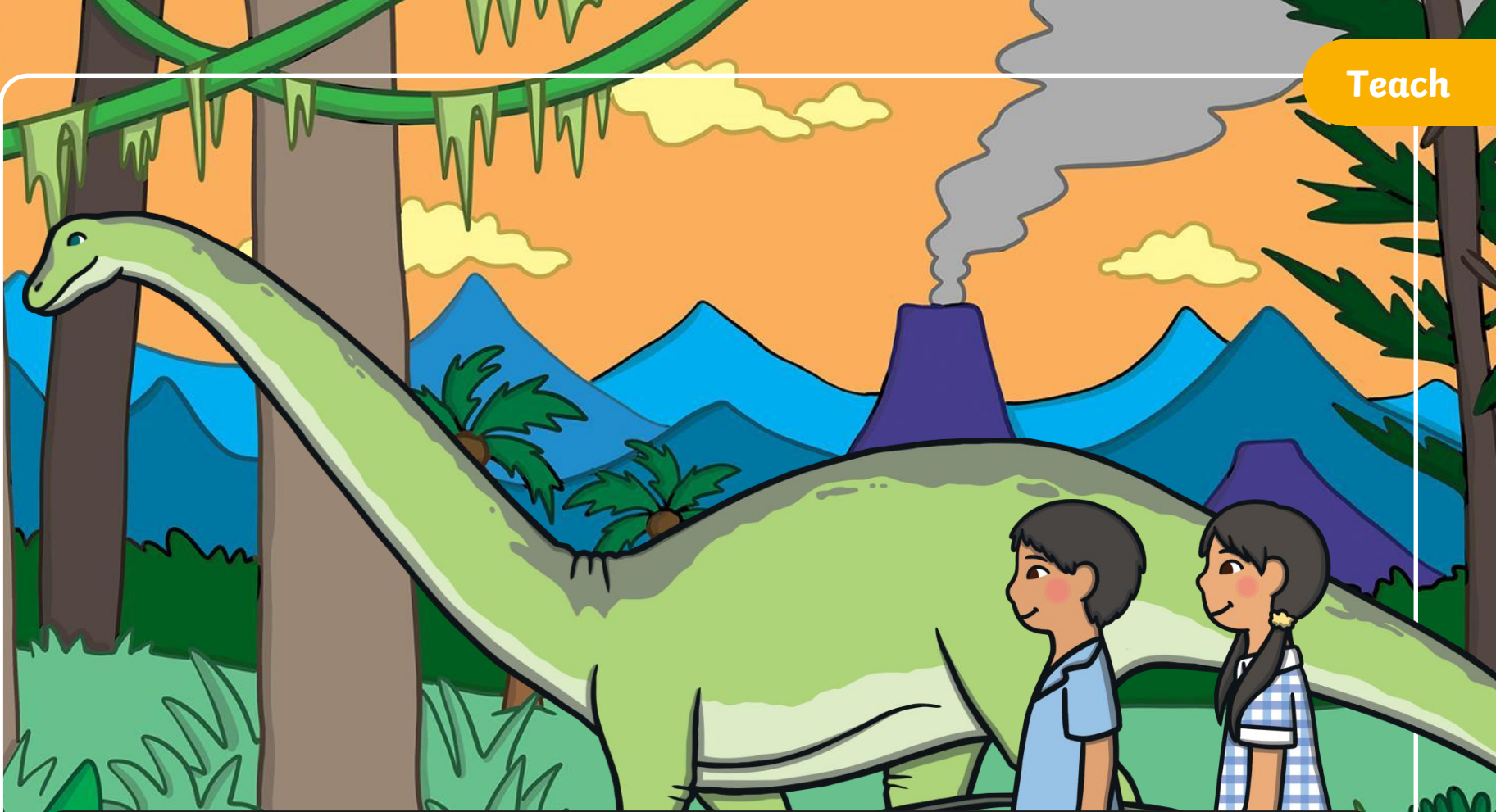
Ben and Sam were walking through the forest. They thought that they heard some elephants but soon realised it could not be! The sound was coming from a group of dinosaurs further up.



“Look!” Ben said to Sam. “There is an Apatosaurus. It looks so different to Steg, but it goes slowly like Steg does.”

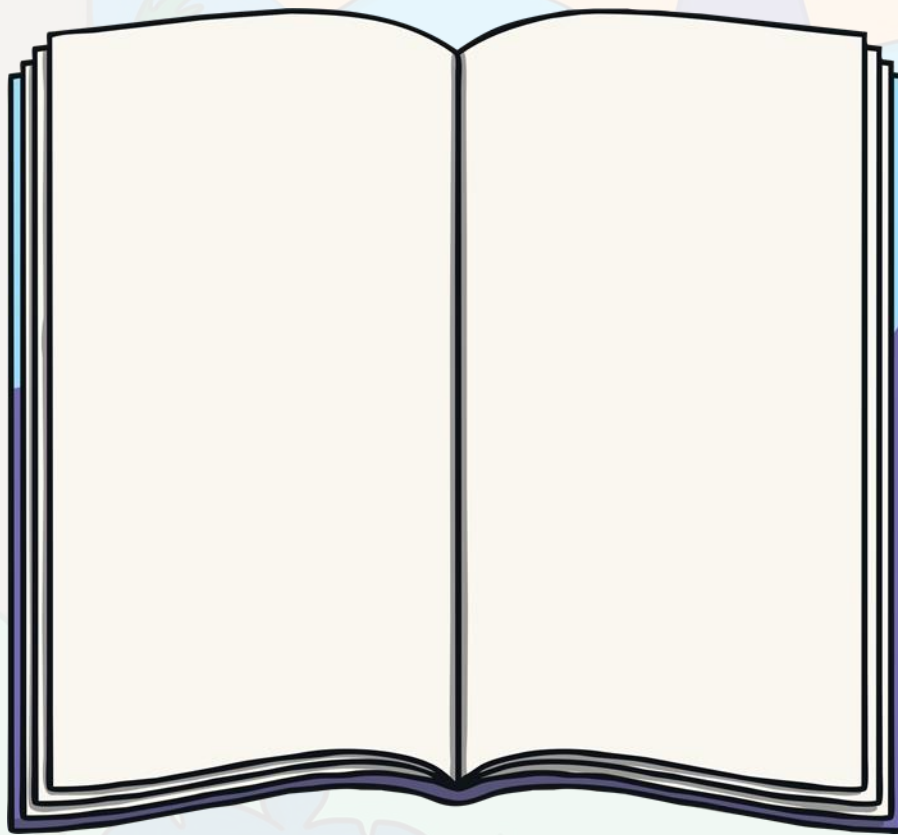
“It has funny toes! Also, a very long neck and a long tail,” said Sam.

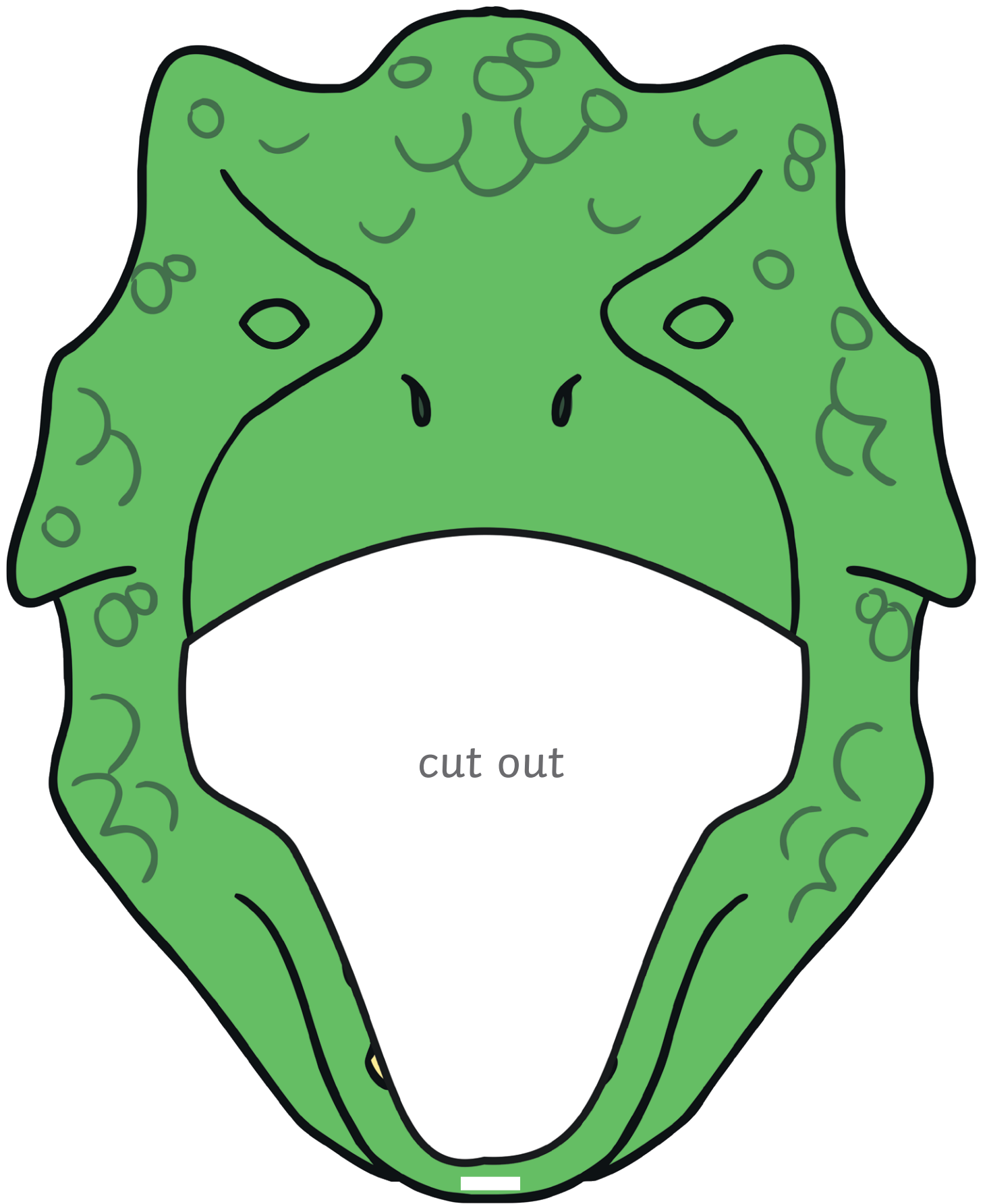


Real or Nonsense Leaf Words
