


Guidance for Video/Audio in PowerPoints

1. Open the folder and copy all the files.






2. Paste the copied files into a new folder.




Sight Word Leaves

This week, we will look at the 'ow' and 'oe' graphemes which both make the /oa/ sound.




Ben's Imagination
