






SPaG: Capital Letters for Names: People and Places

<p>Aim: To be able to use capital letters for names. I can use capital letters for names.</p>	<p>Prior Learning: It will be helpful if children know the uppercase alphabet (letter name and formation).</p>	<p>Resources: Lesson Pack</p>
<p>Success Criteria: I know that names are important and they need a capital letter. I can use capital letters for names of people and pets. I can use capital letters for names of places.</p>	<p>Key/New Words: Capital letter, name, important, people, pets, places.</p>	<p>Preparation: Differentiated Capital Letters for Names Activity Sheet per child. Yes or No Answer Cards per child. The Lesson Presentation should be edited to include names from the class.</p>

	<p>Introductory Activity: Capital Letters for Names Ask the children why their names need capital letters (because they are important). Ask the children to list with their partners 3 names of people that they know. Explain that last names need capitals too. (The Lesson Presentation should be edited to include names from the class). Ask the children who has a pet, what it is called and explain that pets' names would also need capital letters.</p>
	<p>Independent Focused Activity: Composing a Sentence The children complete Part 1 of the differentiated Capital Letters for Names Activity Sheet. Can the children use a capital letter for the names of the boy, girl and cat?</p>
	<p>Review Activity: Capital Letters for Names of Places Ask the children to tell their partners 2 names of places they have visited. Explain to the children that places are also names. Look for children who remember that names are important, so they have a capital letter. Look at the next slide. Discuss who she is and where she lives. Reveal the sentence. Ask the children to discuss with their partners what they notice and where the capital letters should be. Look for children who can explain that they are names.</p>

	<p>Consolidation Activity: Composing a Sentence Children to complete Part 2 of the Challenge on the differentiated Capital Letters for Names Activity Sheet.</p>
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	<p>Assessment/Application Activity: Yes or No Call out a selection of nouns and proper nouns e.g. Thomas, pencil, London. The children hold up Yes or No Answer Cards to show their answers.</p>
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
