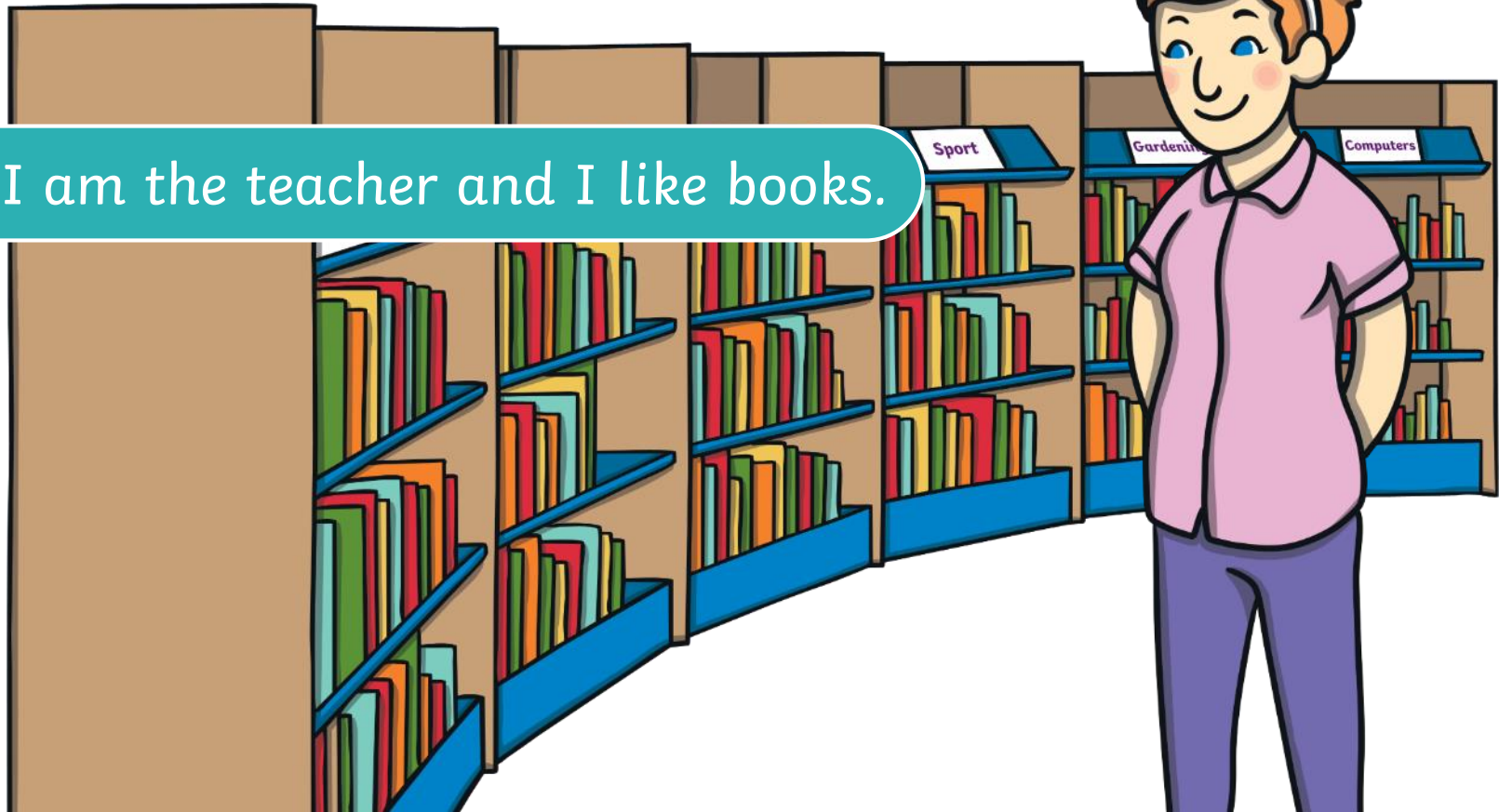

I am the teacher and I like books.



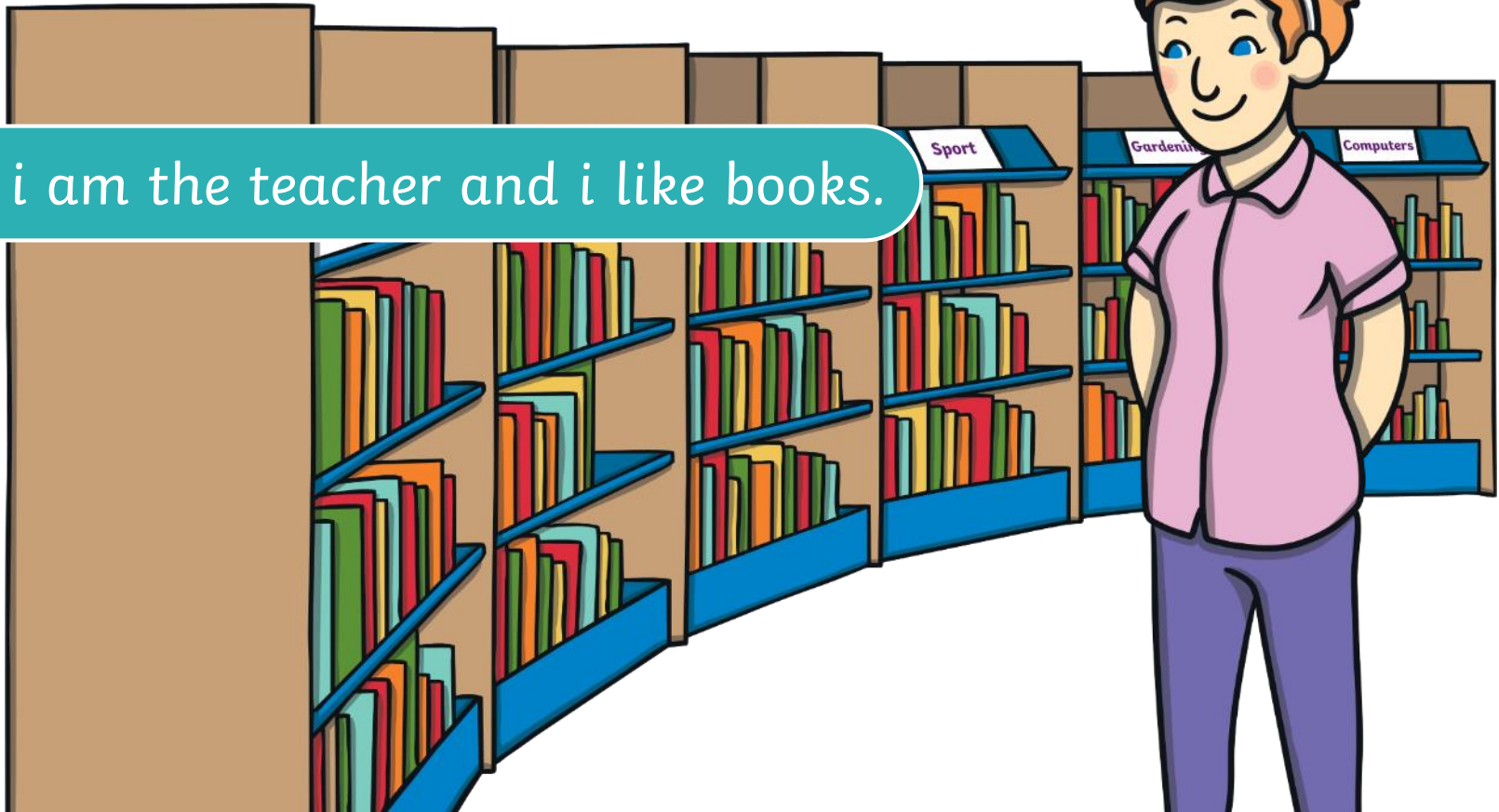


# Capital Letter for 'I'
