Children use and understand the language of height such as tall, taller, tallest, short, shorter and shortest. They use their understanding of height to find objects which are taller, shorter or the same height as other objects. Children then solve a problem to identify a child's teacher based on their height.

What does your object need to be taller than?
What can you find that is taller than a bin?
What does your object need to be shorter than?
Is your object shorter than you?
If not, what can you find that is taller than the bin but shorter than you?

Tell me about the teachers.
What do we know about Dom's teacher?
Who could this be?
How do you know?
