Top Tip

-er and -est suffixes can be added to the end of an adjective. Adding -er makes the adjective a comparative, e.g. 'cold' becomes 'cold<u>er</u>'. When adding -est as a suffix, the adjective becomes the 'most' it can be, e.g. 'clean' becomes 'clean<u>est</u>'.
