'c' as in **c**at and s**c**ab




'ch' as in school and

These words all have the sound /k/ spelt with 'k' or 'c' in them. Look carefully at the **letter** that comes after it.



Come up with a rule for when you spell the sound /k/ with a 'k' and when you spell it with a 'c'.



Most of the letters next to the /k/ sound are vowels.

The **vowels** are:





The sound /k/ is spelt with a 'k' before 'e', 'i' and 'y'


The sound /k/ is usually spelt with a 'c' before 'a', 'o' and 'u'

The cing was in the tower.


Being a spy is a riscy job.


Choose two words to put into your own sentence. Use one with the sound /k/ spelt 'k' and one spelt 'c'. Here's an example:
