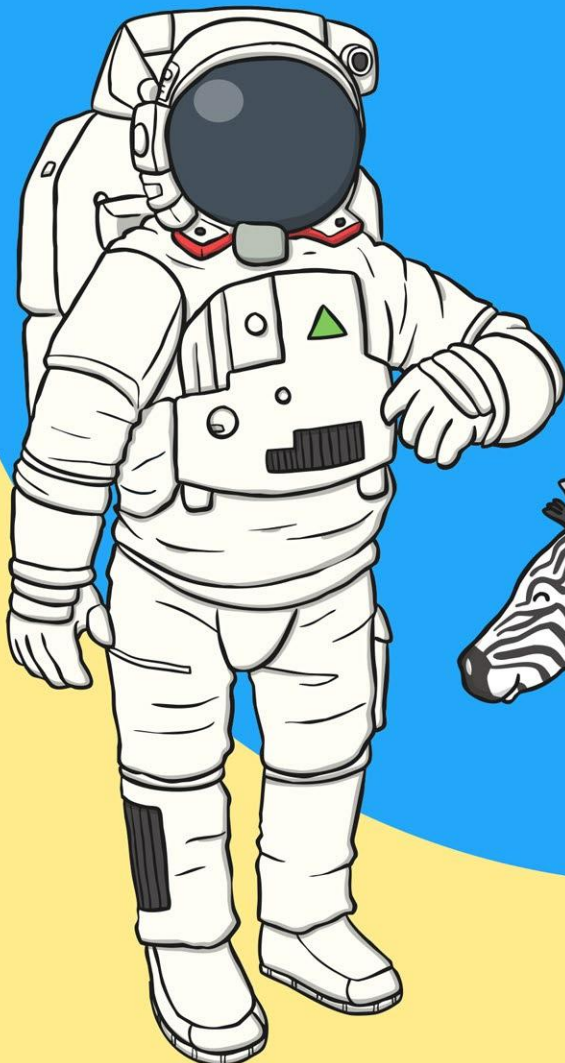


Vocabulary Grammar and Punctuation Terminology

Letter

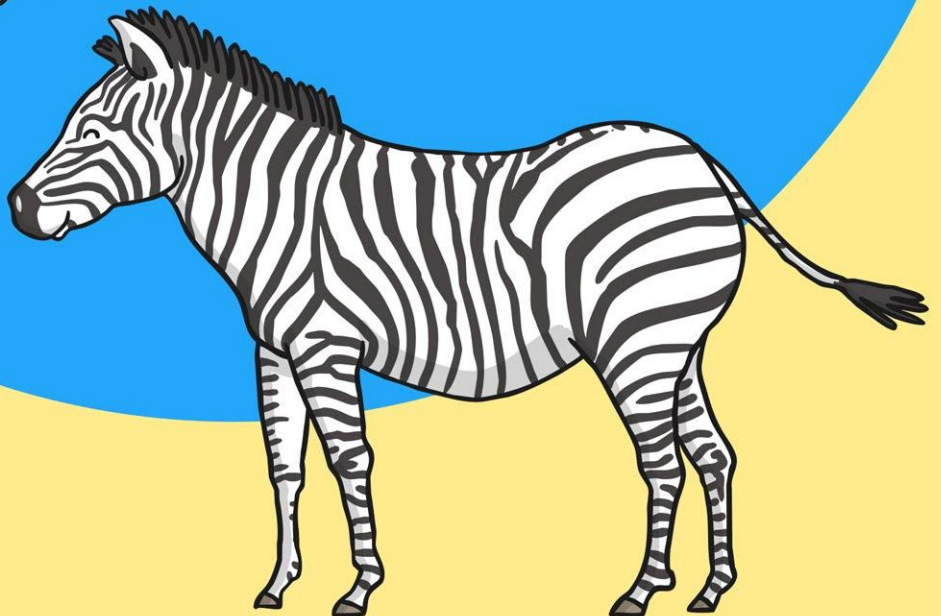
A written mark that stands for a speech sound; specific character of an alphabet.

Word

A sound, group of sounds, or the symbols for such sounds in writing that have some meaning. Words are a basic unit of language.

car

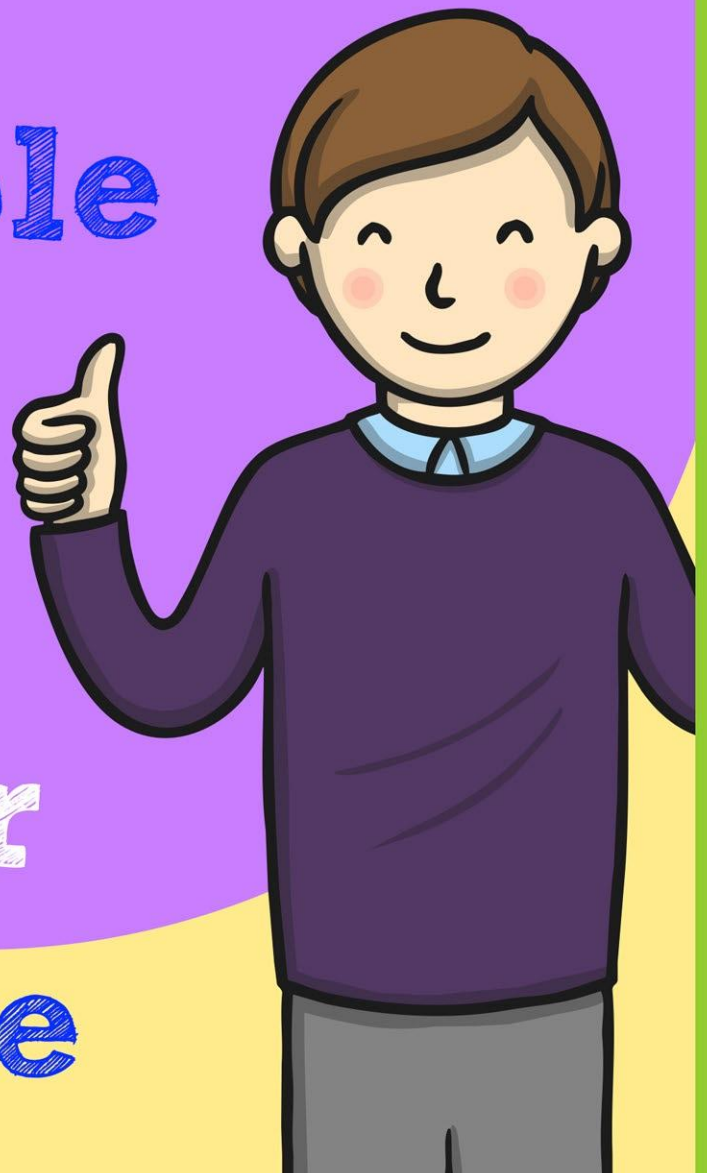

Vocabulary Grammar and Punctuation Terminology

Sentence

A complete unit of words in either writing or speech with a clear beginning and a full stop.

A sentence usually has a subject and a verb. Sentences can state things, ask questions, give commands or be exclamations.

- **I got a bike and a football for my birthday.**
- **If you like we can have chips for tea.**
- **There' s no tennis today because it' s raining.**

Capital Letter

A letter of the alphabet used for proper nouns and to start a sentence.

Look at Gary!

My dog is
called Peaches.

Punctuation Marks

Punctuation marks are essential when you are writing. They show the reader where sentences start and finish and if they are used properly they make your writing easy to understand.

**What time are we
playing basketball?**

Stop that!

**The animals are
running free.**

Full Stop

A full stop is used at the end of a sentence or abbreviation.

All their meals arrived
at the same time.

Exclamation Mark

An exclamation mark is used after a word or words that express strong feelings.

“Look up !”

singular,



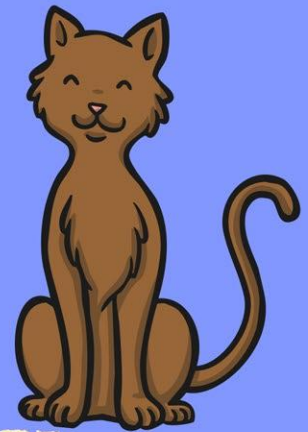
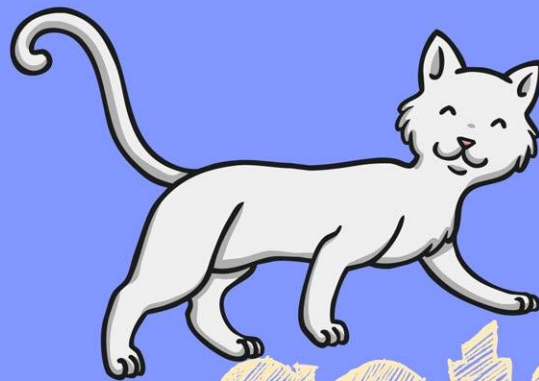
Vocabulary Grammar and Punctuation Terminology
