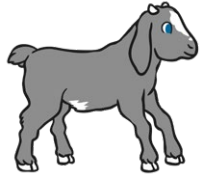


The Three Billy Goats Gruff

Soon, the biggest Billy Goat Gruff came over the bridge.

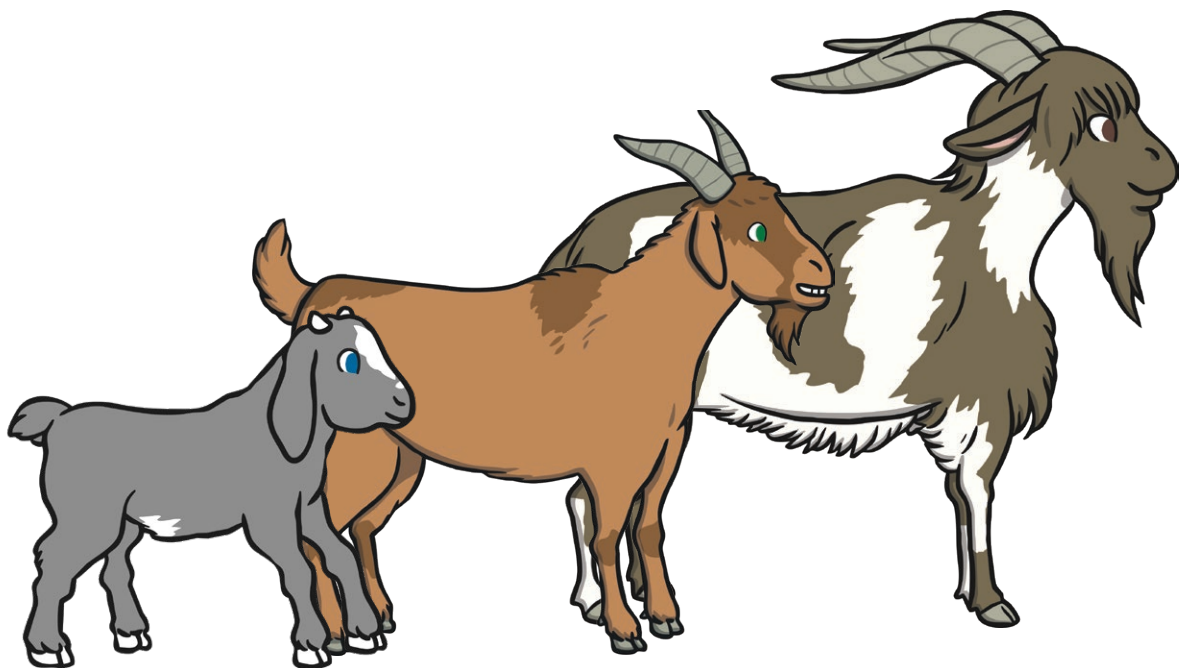

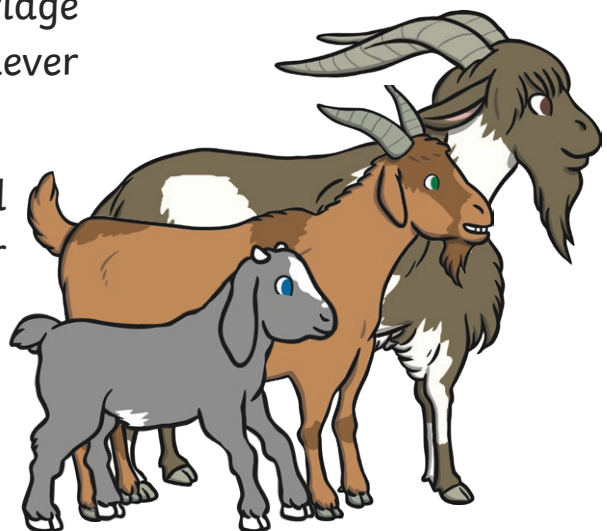
