Stepping Stones

Level 6

To travel across a 'swamp'

Phonic Objective: To read words containing the focus grapheme/s.

Resources

· Word Cards for focus grapheme/s

Large Group Activity - Quick Physically Active Phonics Activity

5-8 minutes

Identify a starting side of the hall or classroom with a sign /chalk/skipping rope laid on the floor.

- 1. Split the class into teams of no more than 5 children.
- 2. Give each team a pack of Word Cards.
- 3. 'We are going to pretend the floor is a swamp and that you have to travel from one side to the other by standing on these 'stepping stones.' Show children the word cards.
- 4. Ask the teams to read one of the word cards. This will become the first 'stepping stone' that they can stand on.
- Encourage the team to read more of their words cards in order to lay more 'stepping stones' to try and cross to the other side.
- 6. The first team to read all of their word cards and reach the other side is the winner.



Assessment

 Can the children read the words containing different graphemes that represent the same phoneme?

More Ideas to Try

- Variation 1: Ask the teams to spread their word cards from one side to
 the other to make a 'path' of 'stepping stones'. Ask the children to travel
 across the 'stepping stones' one at a time by each reading the words
 as they land on them.
- Variation 2: Play the game as 'Variation 1' but this time choose two
 or three children to be crocodiles. These children can go anywhere in
 the swamp and can 'eat' a stepping stone and make it disappear. The
 crocodile children must be able to read the words before they 'eat'
 them (pick them up). The teams must try to cross the swamp before
 their stepping stones are gone.
