This week, we have been learning to add the suffix **-es** to words ending in **y**.



Adding -es to to a noun makes it plural, which means there is more than one. Sometimes, when the noun ends in y , we change the y to an i and then add -es .	teddy baby	teddies babies
When the y is part of a digraph, such as ay , oy or ey , we only need to add -s .	toy monkey	toys monkeys
These rules are the same for verbs. Adding -es or -s to a root verb changes it from 1 st person to 3 rd person, e.g. I carry, he carries.	carry spray	carries sprays

Common Exception Words

We have been learning to spell the common exception words **autumn** and **gone**.

Grammar

A plural noun means there is more than one of something. Often, we add -s or -es to make nouns plural, e.g. dogs, foxes

Although, there are some exceptions, e.g. 'children' and 'sheep'.


