

This week, we have been learning to add the suffix **-es** to words ending in **y**.



Level 6

<p>Adding <b>-es</b> to a noun makes it plural, which means there is more than one.</p> <p>Sometimes, when the noun ends in <b>y</b>, we change the <b>y</b> to an <b>i</b> and then add <b>-es</b>.</p>	<p><b>teddy</b>    <b>teddies</b></p> <p><b>baby</b>    <b>babies</b></p>
<p>When the <b>y</b> is part of a digraph, such as <b>ay</b>, <b>oy</b> or <b>ey</b>, we only need to add <b>-s</b>.</p>	<p><b>toy</b>    <b>toys</b></p> <p><b>monkey</b>    <b>monkeys</b></p>
<p>These rules are the same for verbs.</p> <p>Adding <b>-es</b> or <b>-s</b> to a root verb changes it from 1<sup>st</sup> person to 3<sup>rd</sup> person, e.g. I carry, he carries.</p>	<p><b>carry</b>    <b>carries</b></p> <p><b>spray</b>    <b>sprays</b></p>

### Common Exception Words

We have been learning to spell the common exception words **autumn** and **gone**.

### Grammar

A plural noun means there is more than one of something. Often, we add **-s** or **-es** to make nouns plural, e.g. **dogs**, **foxes**

Although, there are some exceptions, e.g. '**children**' and '**sheep**'.
