Frog

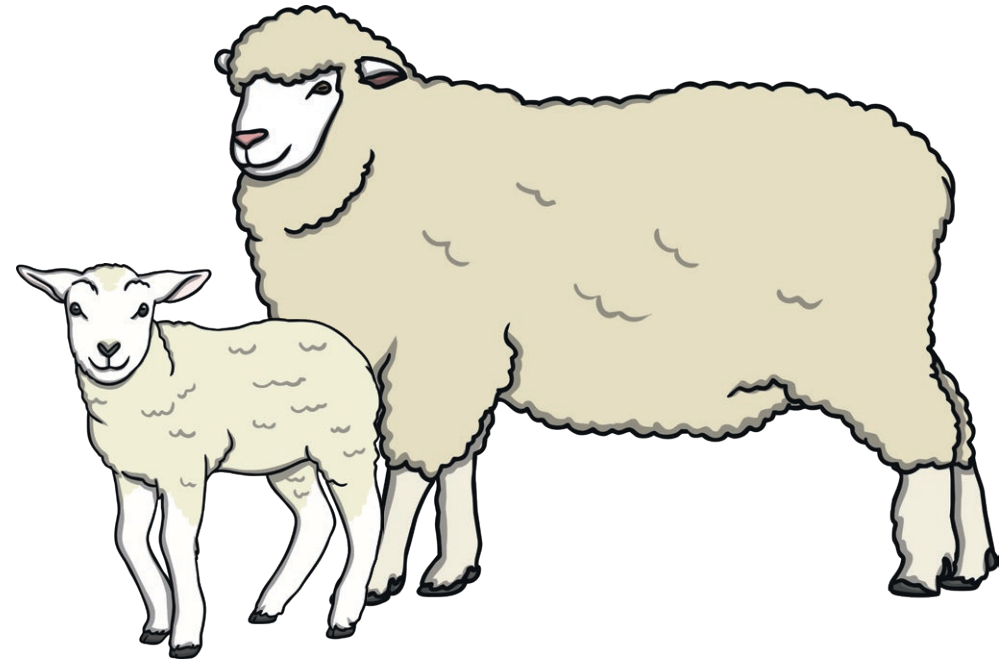
Frogs lay eggs called frogspawn. Tadpoles hatch out of these eggs. Tadpoles don't look like adult frogs. As they develop and grow, they start to grow legs, their heads get bigger and their lungs develop. They are now called froglets. After they've developed, adult frogs have no tail, strong legs and live on land and in water.

Chicken



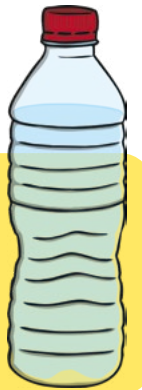
Chickens lay eggs. A chick hatches from the egg (this is called a hatchling). The chick is small and has soft, fluffy feathers. They can be yellow. Although there are some differences, they do look like their adult. The chick grows bigger, stronger and their feathers develop to become an adult chicken.

Sheep



Sheep give birth to live young (meaning not hatched from an egg). They look like their adults when they are born. Young sheep are called lambs. They are weak at first but grow bigger and stronger as they develop.
