What Does Survival Mean?

Dictionary Definition

A state of surviving; remaining alive.

There are many different habitats that animals and humans can survive in.

Animals usually have special features that help them to survive such as thick fur or are able to burrow deep into the ground.

Animals and humans have changed over time to adapt to the habitat they survive in.



Oxygen is our most basic need.

Humans and animals need this to survive.

Other than the air we breathe, water is essential for survival.

Different animals need different amounts of water.



It is estimated that a person cannot survive for more than 3-4 days without water.

If there is no water a human or animal becomes ill because their organs stop working properly. They cannot survive.

Clean water is needed to keep a body healthy. Dirty water can lead to illness.

If you have a good water supply the next essential need is food.



Food

A human or animal needs to move around to get shelter and or water and needs energy to do this. Brains are also fuelled by food energy.

Food gives bodies the energy to stay healthy and to be able to function properly.



A body that does not have food can survive for quite a long time by using up fat reserved in the body.

A shelter that helps to keep your body at a constant temperature is also a necessity. Without shelter a body is exposed to temperatures or weather that can be harmful.

A shelter can also act as protection from predators.

This could be a place to rest or have babies for animals and humans.

This could also include appropriate clothing for humans as we do not have a covering of fur or feathers to protect our skin.



Sleep

For a long time sleep was not considered a basic human need. Humans need sleep so their body keeps working properly, especially their brain.

Without sleep a brain works less effectively and wrong decisions are made. This means an animals or human might choose to do something that outs them in danger.

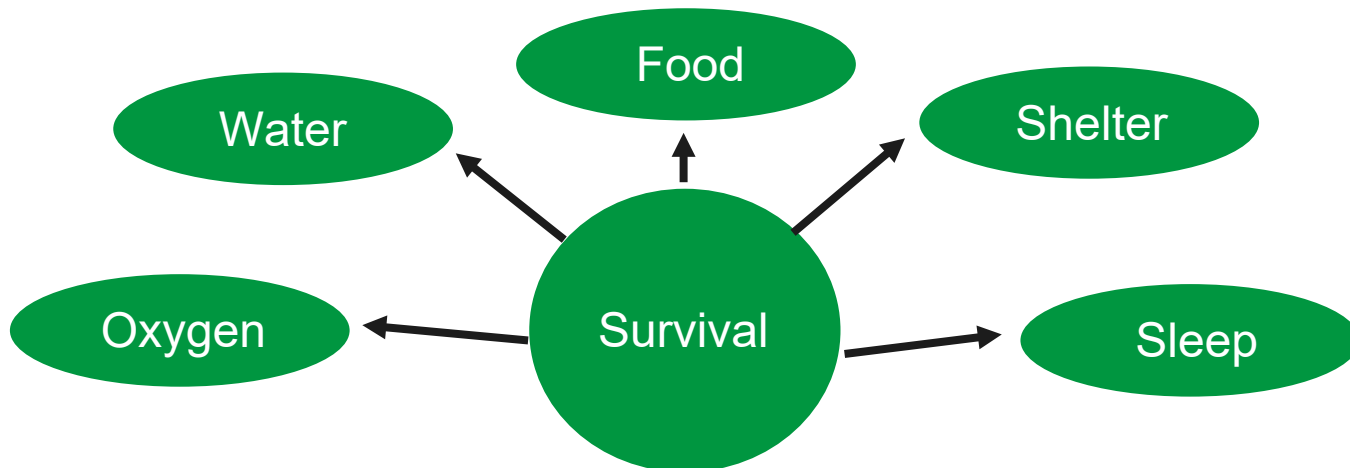

Most animals spend their lives just trying to survive as that is how the are designed.





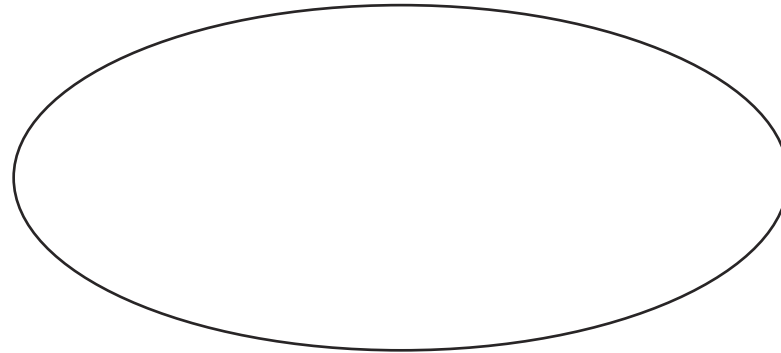
