



Sight Word Wedding Presents

ue can make the same sound as /y/ and /oo/ together, as in 'due'.

due venu








Ben's Clothes

Before the party, Ben has to choose a tie. There are so many different designs and colours to choose from! Pick a tie to reveal a word. Can you read the words?









Sentence Time

Ben and Sam are hoping there will be lots of children to make friends with at the party. What do they ask Mum? Read the sentence then click 'Show' to reveal the answer!









Matching Ties Game



You will need:

- Matching Ties Game Cards
- Matching Ties Challenge

Instructions

- Print and cut out the <u>Matching Ties Game Cards</u>. Fold each card along the dotted line, and glue the folds together so the cards are double-sided. Laminate the cards.
- 2. This game is played with 2-4 players.
- 3. Spread the cards out on the table or floor with the ties and 'ue' words face down.
- 4. One player chooses two cards and says aloud the 'ue' words on the ties.
- 5. If the cards are a pair and match, the player keeps the cards and has another turn.
- 6. If a matching pair of cards are not found, the cards are returned to their original position, face down, and it is the next player's turn.
- 7. Play the game until all the cards have been matched.
- 8. The winner is the player who has found the most pairs.
