

The Lion and the Mouse

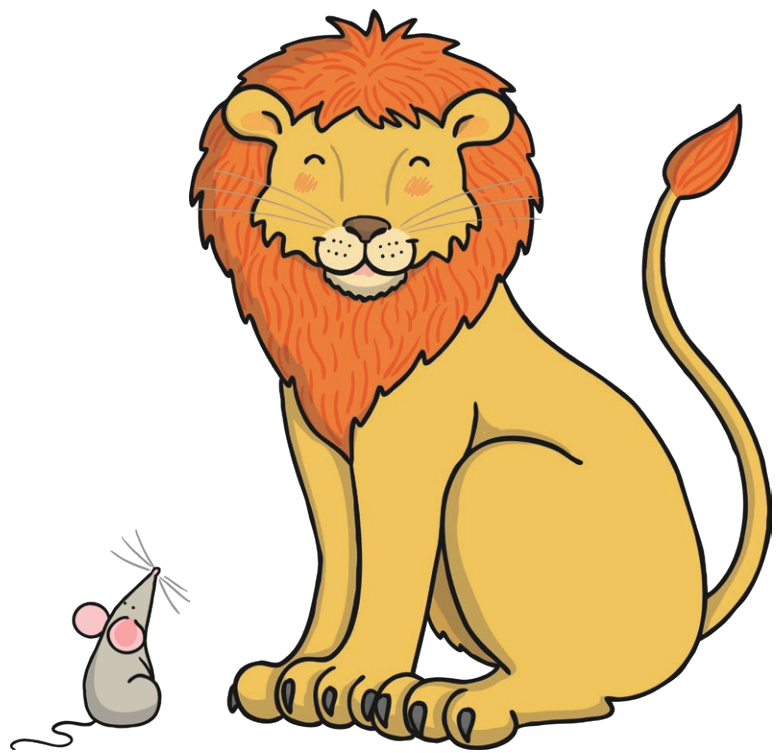
