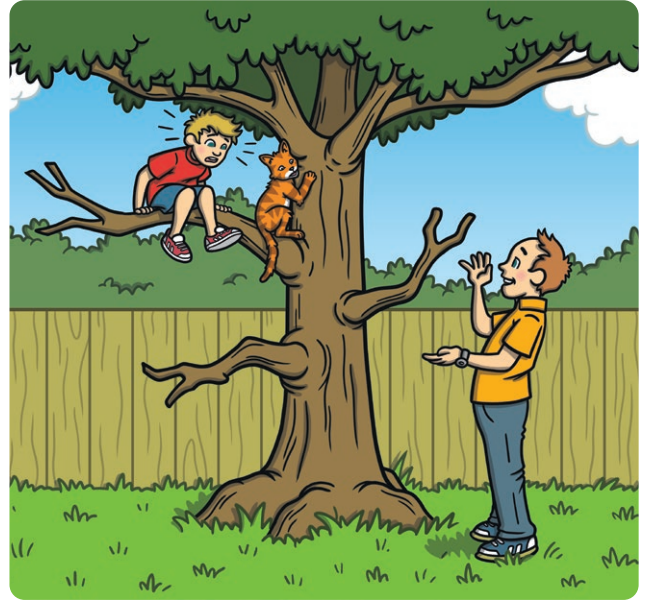
Read the passage, look at the picture and write what is happening.
