

# Drawing

You have been learning the features of drawing applications on the computer, learning how to draw with different shapes and lines, ordering and grouping objects and manipulating shapes and lines.

You have also learned how a drawing is made up of different shapes and lines, sometimes called objects, which are usually in different layers.

Here is a task that will help reinforce this learning:

1. Look out of your window.
2. Draw a picture of what you can see.
3. Don't forget to use as many of the tools as possible.



## Note for Parents: What to draw with?

Google Draw comes with any gmail email account. Word processors and presentation applications have some of the features of drawing applications and can be used, but are not as good as a specific drawing application. There are also various apps for tablets. Look for apps that allow shapes and lines to be changed.

# Leaflets

You have been developing your desktop publishing skills, concentrating on combining text and images effectively on screen.

Here are some suggested tasks that will help reinforce this learning. This will best be done on a desktop publisher, but can be done on a word processor if text boxes can be used.

## First task

Investigate the templates provided with the desktop publisher and word processor. Choose one that you like and could use for a leaflet.

## Second task

Either using your own layout, or using a template from the first task, create a leaflet or brochure for somewhere you have visited, or an imaginary museum or holiday park.

Remember to:

- Think carefully about your layout, making sure it is appropriate to the purpose of your leaflet, and has not got large empty spaces.
- Use fonts and colours carefully to match the purpose of your leaflet or brochure.
