Learning Sequence

Vincie Class	Community: Using the Lesson Presentation, discuss the word 'community' and explain its meaning. Invite children to talk about the communities they are a part of.	
	Online Community: Using the question prompts on the Lesson Presentation, ask children to discuss or note down on whiteboards what they think an online community is. Can children identify online communities that they are a part of?	
	Community Communication: Explain that in a local community, people interact with each other all the time; they often know each other and will see each other in real life. Using the information on the Lesson Presentation, explain that the main difference between a real-life community and an online community is that anyone, anywhere in the world, can communicate with each other. Discuss the positive and negative aspects of this using the prompts on the Lesson Presentation. Can children discuss the positive and negative aspects of online communities?	
	Safe and Sensible: Discuss the differences between how people behave online vs real life, using the prompts on the Lesson Presentation. Show the online comments and ask children to vote, in pairs, whether they would say them in real life. Discuss their responses and the suggested rule to follow: if you wouldn't say it in real life, don't say it online. Can children discuss the differences between communication in real life and online?	
	Online Communication: Children complete the differentiated Online Communication Activity Sheet, considering which forms of online communication they use, online communities they belong to and the positive and negative aspects of online communities? Can children identify online communities they are a part of?
