Describing a Dream Answers

Part A

Example answers: Labels on the drawing may include 'Long Frost', 'Glinting Fang', 'ice', 'cave lion', 'snarling', 'axe', 'red sun' and 'hazy yellow sky'.

A modern child might dream that they are rescuing a hedgehog that is stuck in a bush. They might tell everyone to stand clear while they put on thick gardening gloves before gently helping the terrified hedgehog out of the bush. All their friends might cheer as the grateful creature scurries away.

Part B

Example answer:

Bent Tree dreams that another Long Frost has arrived. She dreams that she awakes and steps out from the tribe tent to see that all the land is covered in ice and snow. Tearfully, she gazes back inside the tent at the sleeping tribe and she waits before waking them. She wants to delay their horror of realising that the omen was indeed a warning of another time of ice and snow. She shivers and pulls her bear skin robes tighter around her wrinkled, fragile shoulders. The dogs are huddled together and looking frightened. She calls out to them that they should not worry. Bent Tree knows what to do. She will perform the Ritual again. It is not too late. A special ceremony can get rid of this Frost. She must protect her tribe. She wakes them, telling them to prepare for the Ritual.
