
The Present Perfect Tense

Part A

The name of Chapter 3 is an example of a sentence in the present perfect tense: 'I have done a few things wrong.'


The present perfect tense uses the verb 'to have' + the past participle form of the main verb (usually ending in -ed or -en).


The present perfect talks about something that happened in the past but that might still be true now or affects something that happens today.



The Present Perfect Tense Answers

Part A

- 1. Dog has bolted away. \checkmark
- 2. The tent has suffered some damage. \checkmark
- 3. Dad looked for Bee. x Dad has looked for Bee.
- 4. Bee complained about plucking duck feathers. x **Bee has complained about plucking duck** *feathers*.
- 5. Rat has learnt how to navigate. \checkmark
- 6. Bent Tree performed many ceremonies. × **Bent Tree has performed many ceremonies.**
- 7. Bee has fallen into a hole. \checkmark
- 8. Bee felt lonely. x *Bee has felt lonely*.
- 9. I have seen scary sights. \checkmark
- 10. I saw a knot in a tree trunk. x I have seen a knot in a tree trunk.
- 11. I have plucked so many feathers. \checkmark
- 12. Bee tried to climb out. x *Bee has tried to climb out*.
