We use 'a' before a word that starts with a **consonant**. (Consonants are all the other letters which are not vowels.) E.g. a cat, a banana.

We use 'an' before a word that starts with a **vowel** sound. (Vowels are a, e, i, o and u.) E.g. an umbrella, an ear.

How to play the game:

- 1. Cut out the word cards below.
- 2. Shuffle the cards and place them face down on the table.
- 3. Take it in turns to pick up a card.
- 4. When it is your turn, say the word with the correct indefinite article (a or an) in front of it.
- 5. Sort the words into two piles in front of you both, a pile for 'a' and a pile for 'an'.
