

Comprehension Answers

Part A

- 1. Who are the main characters in the story?
 - Max, Ma, Pa and Max's sisters, who are called Peony, Pansy and Petunia. The children may also include Uncle B as one of the main characters.
- 2. What do you think the story is going to be about?
 - Example answer: Max and his family dream of reaching the park but no one has ever found a safe place to cross the busy road. I think that Max the hedgehog will make it his mission to find a safe place to cross.
- 3. Where is the story set?
 - The story is set in the garden of number SA in a row of semi-detached houses on a suburban street, which is opposite the park.
- 4. Why was the park so popular with the local hedgehogs?
 - The park was so popular with local hedgehogs because of the good hunting it offered.
- 5. What did Pa give the children a long lecture about?
 - Pa gave the children a long lecture about the problems of road safety for hedgehogs.
