### Which Hedgehog Lives in the UK?

The West European hedgehog lives in the UK. They can grow to around 20cm - 25cm long and can weigh up to 1.2kg.

These hedgehogs enjoy living in hedgerows or at the edge of woodland areas. Their coat is made from around 6000 spines which help to protect them.



Hedgehogs sleep in a safe, quiet place during the cold winter months. They wake up in the spring and then will begin making nests out of things like dead leaves and moss. Hedgehogs will then give birth to between four and six babies and will look after them for eight weeks.

Hedgehog spines are made from a material called keratin. This is the same material that your fingernails are made from!



### How Can I Make a Hedgehog-Friendly Garden?

Unfortunately, lots of people think that the amount of hedgehogs now in the UK is less than it used to be. Luckily, there is a lot that can be done to help hedgehogs. This includes making hedgehogfriendly places where they can sleep and make nests.

Making a garden that is a great place for hedgehogs to explore is easier than you might think. All you need to do is leave a space in your garden with lots of dead leaves, sticks and logs. This will attract lots of insects that hedgehogs will enjoy eating.



### Can I Leave Out Food for a Wild Hedgehog?

If you think that hedgehogs could be visiting your garden, you might want to put out some food for them.




This is because hedgehogs cannot digest milk and drinking it could make them very ill.







### Which Hedgehog is Native to the UK?

The West European hedgehog can be found across the UK and even on some British islands. This spiky creature can grow to around 20cm - 25cm in length and can weigh up to 1.2kg.

These hedgehogs are **nocturnal** and can be found living in hedgerows, parks or at the edge of woodland areas. Their distinctive coat is made up of around 6000 hollow spines which help to protect them from most predators.

Throughout the winter months, hedgehogs **hibernate** in a safe, quiet place where they won't be disturbed. Sometimes, this might be in an unlit bonfire. Because of this, it's important to always thoroughly check bonfires for sleeping hedgehogs before lighting them.





When they wake up in the spring, hedgehogs will begin to make a nest using dead leaves, moss and other easily found items. Female hedgehogs will give birth to between four and six babies and they will look after them for a total of eight weeks. There are several different names given to baby hedgehogs, including 'hoglets', 'hedgehoglets' and 'urchins'.






