For most words that end in 'y', the 'y' is replaced with an 'i' before the -ly suffix is added.

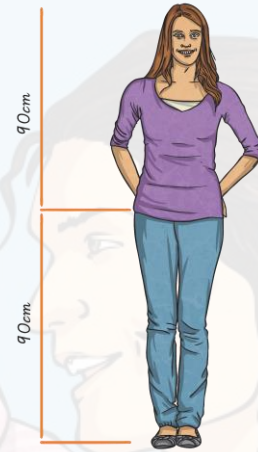

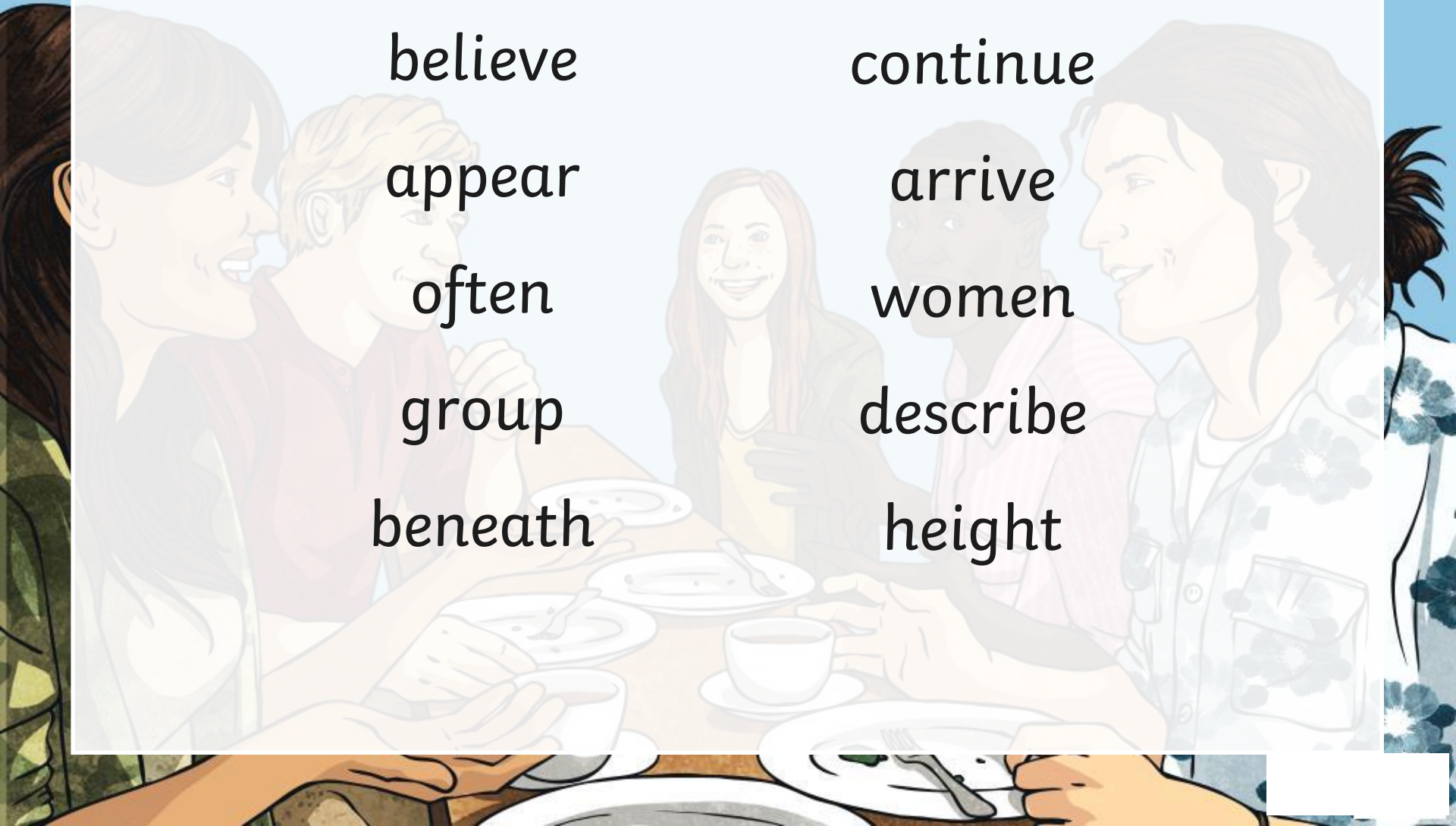
