- 1. Juneteenth is a holiday celebrated on June 19th.
- 2. On January 1, 1863, the Emancipation Proclamation declared that all enslaved people were free.
- 3. On February 1, 1865, more than a year later, President Abraham Lincoln signed the 13th Amendment.
- 4. The 13th Amendment says, "Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime where of the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction."
- 5. On June 19, 1865, two years after the emancipation proclamation, Major General Gordon Granger arrived in Texas by horseback.
- 6. Celebrations often include religious services, family gatherings, food, music, and dancing.
- 7. Many people use Juneteenth to elevate and recognize the beauty of African American culture and achievements.
- 8. On June 17, 2021, Juneteenth became an official federal holiday. President Joe Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act in the East Room of the White House.

- 3. The holiday is also called **Jubilee Day**.
