On June 17, 2021, Juneteenth became an official federal holiday. President Joe Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act in the East Room of the White House.

Juneteenth is a holiday celebrated on June 19th.

On June 19, 1865, two years after the Emancipation Proclamation, Major General Gordon Granger arrived in Texas by horseback.

On January 1, 1863, the Emancipation Proclamation declared that all enslaved people were free.

Many people use Juneteenth to elevate and recognize the beauty of Black American culture and achievements.

Celebrations often include religious services, family gatherings, food, music, and dancing.

The 13th Amendment says, "Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime where of the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction."

On February 1, 1865, more than a year later, President Abraham Lincoln signed the 13th Amendment.
