Prior Learning: In the previous lesson, the children will have learnt how to copy and paste images from a web page. They will have experimented with different methods for copy and paste as well as using colour filters on a chosen search engine.

Learning Sequence

	<p>Remember It: Help from the Experts: Using the Lesson Presentation, ask the children to complete the Help from the Experts Activity Sheet scenarios to write their solutions to the problem. You may give one scenario per group or give each group the full set of scenarios to complete.</p>	
 	<p>Research Detectives: Using the Lesson Presentation, ask the children what they would type into a search engine to find out about their birthday through the years. Show the children how to access the website '_____'. They can experiment by looking for facts about their birthday on this website.</p> <p>Can the children explain how to know if this website is safe to use?</p>	
	<p>On This Day: Using the Lesson Presentation, show the children the examples of the web page they will be using and how to type into the search bar to find facts about their birthday. Then explore the drop-down bars and filters.</p>	
	<p>Widen the Search: Using the Lesson Presentation, explain that if we cannot find enough information, we can widen the search by looking on the Britannica website or by typing what is needed into another search engine.</p> <p>Can the children explain what they could do if they wanted to switch between multiple web pages at the same time?</p>	

	<p>Make It Your Own: Using the Lesson Presentation, discuss what the term plagiarising means. It is important that the children understand to make the facts their own by rewriting the information into their own words.</p>	
 	<p>Calling All Editors! Using the Lesson Presentation and differentiated Article Checklist Activity Sheet, discuss that the children will be making their own magazine article, listing the information they could include and the different ways they could present this. It is recommended that you go through the checklist with the children to discuss and demonstrate any tasks they may be unsure of.</p> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around;"> <div data-bbox="215 369 582 504"> <p> Children are asked to use a basic checklist with easy-to-follow tasks for them to complete their magazine article.</p> </div> <div data-bbox="614 369 957 593"> <p> Children are asked to use a more detailed checklist. This gives them the opportunity to type in URLs, use tabs, use all copy and paste options and filters for images as well as including facts without plagiarising.</p> </div> </div>

It is important that when you find information online, you read it carefully and then rewrite it into your own words when typing in to your document.
