





#### Web Browsers

A web browser allows you to access the Internet, including search engines and other web pages. Here are examples of some web browsers you may be familiar with. Can you guess them from their logos?

Remember: The Internet and the World Wide Web are different. The Internet is lots of computers connected together in a network.

## World Wide Web

The World Wide Web is a collection of web pages found on a network of computers.

The web is very useful as it allows people to share information and communicate with one another from anywhere all around the world. This includes sharing videos, photos, music, blogging and using social networking sites.







## World Wide Web: Where It All Began

Sir Tim Berners-Lee invented the World Wide Web in 1989. Here is what the first ever website looked like. This is very different to how websites look today.

#### World Wide Web

The WorldWideWeb (W3) is a wide-area hypermedia information retrieval initiative aiming to give universal access to a large universe of documents.

Everything there is online about W3 is linked directly or indirectly to this document, including an executive summary of the project, Mailing lists - Policy - November's W3 news - Frequently Asked Onestions -


#### What Is a Search Engine?

A search engine is a service you use on the Internet to help you find information via the World Wide Web.



Once you access a search engine, there is a search box which allows you to type in keywords, phrases or even questions in order to find what you are looking for. Results will appear as photographs, videos or relevant web pages.










## **Staying Safe Online: How To Search Safely**

When you click or press 'enter' after typing in your search, it is important to study the returned results. Make sure you scroll down to check a variety of web pages and that the words you have searched for, appear in the search results of the website you are about to click on.



It is useful to see when the article or website was last updated to find more relevant information.

Sometimes commonly asked questions are shown. You can click on the arrows to reveal the answers.


When searching online, here are some top tips to make your search returns more relevant:

Use quotation marks for keywords - "Buckingham Palace" facts.

Choose relevant keywords- population in the UK.

Add 'for kids' on the end - to make your search returns age appropriate.

Try to be as specific as possible - not too little or too many words.






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

Now you will have a go at completing the Country Files Activity Sheet.




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
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
Use a safe search engine to find a country in each continent below. Draw the flag for the country and fill in the missing information. Why not check more than one website for an accurate population size.
