What is a suffix?




A suffix is something that we add to the **end** of a word that changes its meaning.

Here are some suffixes that you might have met before:



catch<u>es</u>





fa<u>st</u> fast<u>er</u> fast<u>est</u>



pull pull<u>ing</u> pull<u>ed</u> pull<u>er</u>

- ness

is a suffix that turns **adjectives** (words that **describe**) into **nouns** (words that **name**).

Here is an example:


kind	kind <u>ness</u>
Charlie was kind to his friend.	Charlie showed kindness to his friend.
