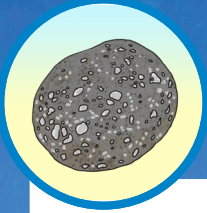

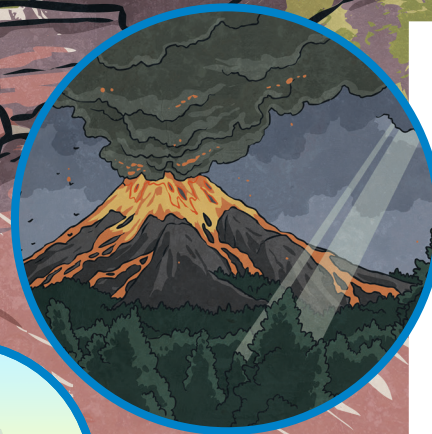

bowl-shaped, broad, cavernous, circular, deep, flat-bottomed, huge, low-rimmed, nested, steep-walled, vast, wide

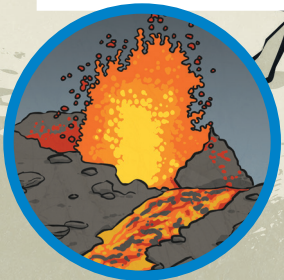
What Does an Eruption Sound Like?
