1.	What is online safety?
<i>Online safety is using your skills and knowledge to keep you and your information safe on all online devices.</i>

<i>A digital citizen is anyone who interacts with any online content or any people online.</i>

<i>Cyberbullying is bullying via any electronic method – it could be email, social media, texts or any other messaging services. It may take the form of direct messages to the person or sharing mean content about the person.</i>
