

Subordinating Conjunctions

A subordinating conjunction is a word which joins a subordinating clause with another clause.

Read the example sentences below. The subordinating conjunction in each sentence is in **bold**. Then write your own sentence using the same subordinating conjunction on the line underneath.



I have a drink **when** I am thirsty.

I get pocket money **if** I do my chores.

The judges think **that** he is the best dancer.

The dog is barking **because** he's hungry.
