
Fixing run-on sentences

Rewrite these run-on sentences as one sentence using a comma and a conjunction. A **run-on sentence** can be corrected by adding a comma and a coordinating conjunction such as <u>and</u>, <u>but</u>, <u>or</u>, <u>so</u>, and <u>yet</u>.

- 2. The pool is always full of people we normally just stay home.
- 3. We needed to get some money we went to the bank.
- 4. Nick bought glasses he never wears them.

- 6. He rented a car he drove it to the beach.
- 7. We wanted to eat pizza my dad ordered sandwiches.
- 8. She can do gymnastics she cannot climb the rope.
- 9. My family wanted a new house we moved to the countryside.
- 10. My hands were cold I put on my gloves.
