Punctuation and Grammar

- Complete the Inverted Commas Activity Sheet.
- **Challenge!** Write a conversation between the brothers after Romulus has rescued Remus.

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Comprehension

- Complete the Romulus and Remus Character Activity Sheet.
- Challenge! Use what you have found to write expanded noun phrases about each character.



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Vocabulary

- Adverbials are words or phrases that tell you how, when or where something happened. Find some adverbials in the story so far. Then find synonyms for these adverbials and write them down.
 Synonyms are different words that have the same meaning. You can use a thesaurus to help you find synonyms.
- Challenge! Use some of these synonyms to write sentences with fronted adverbials.





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Debate

- You are going to debate who in the story has done the right thing so far, Amulius or the twins. Half of your group should take the side of Amulius and half of the group should be on the side of Romulus and Remus. You can use the Romulus and Remus Debate Cards to help you with your arguments.
- **Challenge!** As a group, decide who gave the best argument.

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Draw

- On a plain piece of paper, draw a picture of Amulius' face when he realises who Romulus and Remus really are.
- **Challenge!** Draw a thought bubble by your picture and write what Amulius is thinking.



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Write

- Write a description of the palace using expanded noun phrases using the Palace Prompt Sheet.
- Challenge! Use a thesaurus to find synonyms for some of the words you have used.
